AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES OF PROCEDURE AND CONDUCT OF BUSINESS IN THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, 2007

22. **MR. S.A. IQBAL QADRI** to seek leave under sub-rule (4) of rule 293 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007 to move the following amendments:-

- (1) **Amendment in rule 84.**- In the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007, in rule 84 between the words “a” and “question” occurring in the first line the word “starred” shall be inserted.
- (2) **Amendment in rule 250.**- In the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007, for the first proviso to rule 250, the following shall be substituted, namely:-

“Provided that notices of intention to move for leave to introduce a Bill or a motion for leave to amend the Rules, a notice of amendment in a Bill, or notice of question and a question of privilege shall not lapse.”

23. **MR. S.A. IQBAL QADRI** to move, if leave is granted, under sub-rule (5) of rule 293 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007, that the proposed amendments be taken into consideration.

- (3) **Amendment in rule 82.** In the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007, in rule 82, the following new sub-rules shall be added at the end, and the existing rule shall be re-numbered as sub-rule (1), namely:-

“(2). The number of questions on the list of questions for any day shall not exceed 20; and

(3) One question put to each of the Divisions for which time has been allotted will be placed in sequence in the list of questions and the sequence will be repeated until the questions of the list are exhausted.”

- (4) **Amendment in rule 201.** In the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007, in rule 201, in sub-rule (1), the following proviso shall be added at the end, namely:-

“Provided that any Bill which has been introduced in the Assembly and referred to a Standing Committee will be taken up for consideration by the Committee within 30 days of its introduction in the National Assembly. Once the Committee begins consideration of a Bill, the Committee will conclude its deliberations and present its report to the Assembly within 30 days.”

- (5) **Amendment in rule 250.** In the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007, in rule 250, in the proviso, between the words “Bill” and “and”, a comma and the word “question” shall be inserted.
