

- (iii) Necessary legal action was to be taken in case of casualties, if any, during these protests.
- (iv) Those arrested, during or after the protests, will be set free.
- (v) TLP apologized for hurting the sentiments and causing inconvenience to the citizens, if any, during these protests.

(b) During the Dharna from 1st to 3rd November, 2018, six (06) criminal cases were registered by the ICT Police against the protestors, who were involved in the agitation and roads blockades. In all, 44 accused were arrested and sent to judicial custody. Challans against them were sent by ICT Administration to the concerned courts where they are facing trial.

(c) No damage caused by the protestors to the public and private property, within Islamabad Capital Territory.

(d) Neither any body was seriously injured nor died. No damage was caused to the public / private property by the protestors within Islamabad/ ICT. Therefore, the question of compensation did not arise.

Note: The reply from provincial governments is awaited, despite reminders. The same will be submitted as and when received.

Will the Minister for Planning, Development and Reform be pleased to state the details of Pakistan and China agreement signed to expand industrial cooperation in diverse fields and attract investment in special economic zones?

Minister for Planning, Development and Reform (Makhdoom Khusro Bukhtiar): — During 8th JCC, MoU between Board of Investment (BoI) and National Development & Reform Commission (NDRC) on industrial cooperation signed on Dec. 20, 2018 to support industrial cooperation based on SEZs. Main contents of the MOU include:

- Both Parties will facilitate Foreign Direct Investment (FDI), explore technology transfer cooperation, promote Pakistan's industrialization, relocation of mutually beneficial industries, develop special economic zones, and service sector up-gradation.
- Promote SEZs to attract global brands and enterprises, technologies and best practices.
- Accelerate the development of pillar industries, with a special focus on iron and steel, textile, petro chemicals and mines minerals and other sectors.
- Strengthening cooperation on technical & Vocational Education Training.

— Focus on industries in the SEZs will be export led and import substitution industries. It may be highlighted that in order to put Industrial Cooperation on fast track a CPEC business council has been established. at Annex-I.

— Concessional agreement for Rashakai SEZ was signed between KPEZDMC and Chinese company CRBC during visit of Prime Minister to China.

— Similarly, for promote B2B interaction a Pak-China business forum has been proposed.

— A Pakistan trade and investment was held on 28th April during Prime Minister's visit to China and was attended to by 300 Chinese companies and around 50 Pakistan side enterprises.

Regular cleanliness is being done in commercial areas (on daily basis) and in residential areas (on alternate day). As and when any complaint regarding cleanliness is received on Helpline 1334 & 0335-5001213 (WhatsApp & SMS), prompt action is being taken within shortest possible time.

293. ***Mr. Faheem Khan:**

Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) is there any kind of tax on all types of educational products at present in the country;*
- (b) if so, the item-wise details with rate and reasons therefor;*
- (c) if the answer to part (a) is in affirmative, whether it is a fact that the same tax/taxes is in violation of Article 25A of the Constitution of Pakistan;*
- (d) if so, action taken against the responsible thereof;*
- (e) is there any proposal under consideration of the Government to abolish all kind of taxes on educational products;*
- (f) if the answer to part (e) is in affirmative, the time by which it will be implemented; if not, the reasons thereof?*

Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs:

(a) SALES TAX

There is no sales tax on import and supplies of educational material such as books and stationery as per details below:

“Following goods are zero-rated under Fifth Schedule and also exempted under Sixth Schedule to Sales Tax Act, 1990:

- (i) Colors in sets (PCT heading 3213.1000).
- (ii) Writing, drawing and marking inks (PCT heading. 3215.9010 and 3215.9090)
- (iii) Erasers (PCT heading 4016.9210 and 4016.9290)
- (iv) Exercise books (PCT heading 4820.2000)

- (v) Pencil sharpeners (PCT heading 8214.1000)
- (vi) Geometry boxes (PCT heading 9017.2000)
- (vii) Pens, ball pens, markers and porous tipped pens (PCT heading 96.08)
- (viii) Pencils including color pencils (PCT heading 96.09)”

Additionally, the inputs/raw materials of these items are also zero-rated subject to determination of required quantities.

Further, all book, including text books are also exempt under the Sixth Schedule to the Sales Tax Act, 1990. Laptop and computers are also exempt from payment of sales tax.

CUSTOMS

Nineteen (19) educational products are mentioned in Pakistan Customs Tariff (Volume-I).

(b) SALES TAX

As stated above, there is no sales tax on educational materials.

CUSTOMS

Their details alongwith prevalent import duty structure is enclosed as **Annex-A**.

(c) 1. It is pertinent to mention that except for books & dictionaries import of all education products which are being locally manufactured is subject to the highest rate of 20% Customs Duty (CD). Under Pak-China Free Trade Agreement (FTA) as well as under SAFTA, their import is however, allowed at concessional rate of CD ranging from 0% to 16%.

2. In order to encourage local manufacturing of stationery items exemption of CD in excess of 5% on import of subcomponents and components and complete exemption of CD on import of raw material is available to local manufacturers under SRO 565(I)/2006 dated 05-06-2006.

3. Further, exemption of Customs Duty is also available on education goods, imported by or donated to nonprofit making education and research institutions in terms of provision of PCT heading 9915.

(e) Not applicable, as goods specified clause are already exempt or zero-rated.

294. ***Mr. Naveed Aamir Jeeva:**

Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs be pleased to state the total value of foreign exchange reserves in the country at present?

Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs: The total value of Pakistan's foreign exchange reserves as of 06th May, 2019 is \$15911.8 million, of which reserves held with SBP are \$8923.3 million while reserves held with commercial banks are \$6988.5 million.

295. ***Mr. Saleh Muhammad:**

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that National Data Base and Registration Authority (NADRA) is charging rupees 700 for the issuance of Computerized National Identity Card for the first time;*
- (b) whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to issue the CNIC first time free of cost and NADRA registration may be made obligatory; and*
- (c) the time by which Government will make the issuance of CNIC first time free of cost alongwith the detail thereof?*

Minister for Interior (Mr. Ijaz Ahmad Shah): (a) * First time CNIC is processed without any charges (Teslin Based).

* During last year, over 2 million free of cost CNICs have been issued to fresh applicants.

(b) Already Implemented.

(c) Already Implemented.

296. ***Syed Imran Ahmad Shah:**

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that E-12, which was launched by the CDA two decades ago, could not develop so far, despite the fact that legitimate allottees have paid dues against their plots; if so, the reasons thereof; and*
- (b) *the steps being taken in this regard?*

Minister for Interior (Mr. Ijaz Ahmad Shah): (a) Yes the land and Build up properties for Sector E-12 were acquired in 1985 and 1987. The possession of the sector could not be taken over by CDA due to objections / unrealistic demands from affectees, litigation etc. However, the development work of sector E-12 was not possible due to non-possession of land.

(b) The compensation as well as rehabilitation benefits have since been paid/given to most of the affectees. An operation has been started in coordination with ICT Administration by Enforcement Directorate, CDA and nearly 2000 Kanal land has been vacated and still the operation is going on. The outstanding compensation of land is being extended to the affectees through a sub-office established on site.

297. ***Mr. Muhammad Hashim Notezai:**

Will the Minister for Planning, Development and Reform be pleased to state:

- (a) *the number of dams proposed to be constructed for Balochistan in current PSDP with district-wise details; and*
- (b) *whether there is any proposal to construct a dam in each District of Balochistan; if not, the justification thereof?*

Minister for Planning, Development and Reform (Makhdoom Khusro Bukhtiar): (a) In the current PSDP, a total number of 592 dams are proposed/ under construction/ constructed in Balochistan. These dams are located in 27 districts of the province. The district wise detail is as under:

(b) Identification of sites for construction of dams is solely carried out by the Government of Balochistan and Federal Government has no role in locating these dam's sites. Moreover, dams are proposed on waterways keeping several engineering factors like suitability of site in terms of topography, geology, hydrology and agricultural potential as well as technical soundness of design and economic viability. Therefore, it is not tenable from engineering standpoint to essentially construct dam in each district while ignoring the factors mentioned above.

Moreover, in the proposed PSDP 2019-20, Package-IV of 100 Dams Project is included under which, 23 new dams are to be constructed in different districts of Balochistan. In addition to that, 9 other dams' projects in different districts of Balochistan are also included.

298. ***Dr. Shazia Sobia Aslam Soomro:**

Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs be pleased to state whether it is a fact that Government has failed to

control the fiscal deficit and it is expected to go beyond the set target for current fiscal year; if so, the reasons thereof?

Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs: Fiscal Deficit for 2017-18 at 6.6 % of GDP was inherited by the present government. For the year 2018-19 fiscal deficit is targeted at 5.6 % of GDP. Based on provisional data fiscal deficit for first half of current financial year is 2.7% of GDP. The government has taken various measures to curtail the expenditure and to increase the revenue receipts to keep the deficit within limits.

299. ***Mr. Muhammad Hashim Notezai:**

Will the Minister for Planning, Development and Reform be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that funds have been allocated in PSDP for cutting Sultan Ascent, listed with Noshki Hills Unit Organization for many years which later on are removed from PSDP; if so, the reasons thereof;*
- (b) *whether climbing this Ascent, many vehicles turned turtle causing loss of precious human lives;*
- (c) *if so, the steps taken by the Government in this regard?*

Minister for Planning, Development and Reform (Makhdoom Khusro Bukhtiar): (a) The scheme in question has neither been funded through PSDP nor any record is available in the M/o Planning, Development & Reform.

(b) Since, this Ministry has no record available hence not in a position to comments.

(c) As above.

301. ***Syed Imran Ahmad Shah:**

Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) why Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP) is designated as certification agency and why does FBR itself not certify NGOs at its own exclusively;*
- (b) the time by which FBR itself will start issuing certificates exclusively instead of by a private NGO PCP;*
- (c) whether PCP charges exorbitant fees for issuance of certificate; if so, the reasons thereof; and*
- (d) the steps being taken by the Government to reduce fees for issuing certificate?*

Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs: (a) It is one of the requirements for approval of an NPO under the law, as per clause (g) of sub-rule (2) of Rule 211 of Income Tax Rules 2002, to provide a detailed report with regard to the performance of the organization for achieving its aims and objects during the preceding financial year preceding the date on which application is made, duly evaluated and certified by an independent certification agency approved by an authority designated by the Government of Pakistan. Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP) is a designated Certification Agency by the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR), Government of Pakistan vide S.R.O. No. 1116(1)/2003 dated December 18, 2003.

PCP is currently the only approved certification agency as it is the only entity which has till date applied for this status. Other certification agencies will be notified when and if such agencies apply for this status to FBR.

(b) As mentioned, before it is a requirement under the law for approval of an entity as NPO to PCP to provide a detailed report with regard to the performance of the organization for achieving its aims and objects duly evaluated and certified by an independent certification agency approved by an authority designated by the Government of Pakistan

(c) No payment is made by FBR to PCP. However, PCP as an independent agency charges fees from the Non-Profit Organizations for its services that applies for certificate. FBR has no influence over the fee structure of PCP

(d) PCP is a non-profit organization registered with Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) and licensed under section 42 of the Companies Ordinance 1984 (presently Companies Act 2017). The fee structure of PCP, being a non-governmental private entity, can only be governed by itself and it is strictly under its own purview. As mentioned above, PCP is currently the only approved certification agency as it is the only entity which has till date applied

for this status. Other certification agencies will be notified when and if such agencies apply for this status to FBR.

302. ***Ms. Zaib Jaffar:**

Will the Minister for Planning, Development and Reform be pleased to state whether work is in progress on western route of CPEC; if not, the reasons thereof?

Minister for Planning, Development and Reform (Makhdoom Khusro Bukhtiar): Western Route has been accorded priority by incumbent government as it connects less developed areas of Pakistan. The work on western route to connect Kasghar with Gwadar port is in progress. Western route consists of following sections:

Minister for Interior (Mr. Ijaz Ahmad Shah): (a)

- All NADRA Registration Centres have female Data Entry Operators for processing of females except few centres.
- 15x separate female centres are operational country wide.
- Recently, NADRA has hired 375x female operators for processing of female applicants.

304. ***Mr. Ali Gohar Khan:**

Will the Minister for Privatization be pleased to state whether any strategy is being prepared for the privatization of Pakistan Steel Mills in future alongwith the detail of planning of privatization of Institutions or corporations facing deficit?

Minister for Privatization (Mr. Muhammadmian Soomro): Pursuant to the decision of the Cabinet Committee on Privatisation (CCoP) dated October 31, 2018, Pakistan Steel Mills Corporation (PSMC) has been delisted from the Privatisation Programme. The Cabinet ratified the decision of the CCoP on November 01, 2018.

The Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the Cabinet on May 3, 2019 recommended hiring of Consultant by Privatisation Commission to consider various aspects for future course of action. The Privatisation Commission have

also requested Ministry of Industries & Production to first evaluate Legal and Constitutional aspects (in consultation with Law & Justice Division) before initiating summary for the CCoP. Subsequently, the final decision will be taken by the CCoP and the Cabinet.

Moreover, in the Phase II Privatisation Programme, there are many Institutions/ Corporations/ PSEs facing deficit. However, Policy Recommendations from the concerned Ministries / Divisions are still awaited, in this regard.

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state:

- (a) the total HR strength of NADRA;*

Minister for Interior (Mr. Ijaz Ahmad Shah): (a) Active HR strength of NADRA as on 24th April, 2019 is 16311.

(b) NADRA is an autonomous organization and has its own regulations and proper service structure. Accordingly, all NADRA employees are governed under NADRA Ordinance, 2000 and NADRA Employees Service Regulations, 2002.

(c) Exact number of Regular employees as on 24th April, 2019 is 9,376. There is no MPS scale based employee in NADRA.

(d) No employee (BPS) has been promoted nor given pay raise twice since 2013. There is no MPS scale employee in NADRA.

(e) No MPS scale exists in NADRA. Consequent upon organizational and job requirement performance evaluation, career path and recommendation of the concerned departmental head, few employees have been granted "T" scale in 2018.

(f) A total of 3546 personnel (including contingent paid staff) have been hired from 1st Jan, 2014 to 31st December, 2018. Length of service is not a sole determinant of promotion in "O" and "T" scale rather promotion of contractual employees is strictly based on recorded performance indicators and efficiency of employee. 89 employees with 3 or less than 3 years service have been promoted during their contract period in 2018 (**Annex-A**). No employees in "O" and "T" scale has been hired without Test/Interview.

(g) 105 employees have been granted more than 4 increments in 2018 (**Annex-B**).

(h) Details of employees visited abroad on NADRA expenses are attached at **Annex-C**.

(i) NADRA offices are hired in the light NADRA Hiring Policy-2017 "Official Accommodation" duly approved by NADRA Authority Board. This policy is promulgated under Section 5 and 6 of NADRA Ordinance 2000. Buildings are being hired through, tendering/advertisement process. In case of no response or due to any other valid reason, direct selection of a building takes place through board of offices, duly justifying the demanded rent through price reasonability of the vicinity.

Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs: Government of Pakistan and the International Islamic Trade Finance Corporation (ITFC), a subsidiary organization of Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) Group, signed a Framework Agreement in April 2018 for a total envelop of US\$ 4.5 billion for the period 2018-2020 (US\$ 1.5 billion annually). So far US\$ 375.00 million has been utilized by PSO and PARCO for import of Petroleum Products during the period of July – December, 2018.

The mode of financing is Islamic Shariah Compliant at the profit rate of one year LIBOR + 2.75% p.a.

The terms & conditions for the next tranche i.e. US\$ 551 million have been finalized and is likely to be signed within days. The financing facility will be used for import of oil and LNG by PSO, PARCO & Pakistan LNG Limited.

— United Arab Emirates: USD 2.0 billion

(b) The terms and conditions of the above financial packages are:

— KSA deposit of USD 3.0 billion is for one year at a profit rate of 3.0 percent per annum. USD 3.24 billion deferred payment oil financing facility is for three years at a profit rate of 3.8 percent per annum.

— UAE deposit of USD 2.0 billion (USD 1 billion for two years and USD 1 billion for one year) is at a profit rate of 3.0 percent per annum.

Minister for Planning, Development and Reform (Makhdoom Khusro Bukhtiar): (a) The province of Balochistan holds special importance under China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) as the province cradles Gwadar city, key impetus for the corridor's genesis, and future gateway to global transshipment and trade routes. CPEC's connectivity to the rest of Belt and Road Corridors further augurs prosperity and economic development for the people of Balochistan, especially its young populace. Balochistan has already attracted infrastructure investment and socio-economic development initiatives worth millions of dollars under the present government. Some of the salient areas of investment and initiatives are as follows:

(b) **Western Corridor**

The government is cognizant of the importance and role road network and connectivity plays in facilitating economic development. The present administration understands the significance of western corridor's role as conduit of integration between less developed regions with more prosperous ones leading to regional equality and uplift. Given the aforementioned and visible economic benefits, prompt development of western corridor remains a priority. Recently inaugurated Zhob-Quetta section of the corridor represents sizable infrastructure investment and lays testament to government's resolve to complete the corridor at the earliest.

Gwadar

Gwadar is the Belt and Road Initiative's (BRI) gateway to global transshipment and economic activity. A number of infrastructure projects have been initiated/ planned for the city of close to US\$ 1.4 billion which aim to provide

better global connectivity and modern infrastructure. Groundbreaking of Gwadar International Airport, Eastbay Expressway, 300MW power plant, infrastructure for Free Zones and Export Processing Zones (EPZs), fresh water treatment and supply, hospital, technical and vocational institute are some of the initiatives to develop an ecosystem to attract private sector investment, leading to job creation and economic prosperity. Besides, a number of other initiatives are also planned to promote industries such as oil and fisheries.

Socio-Economic Development

In addition to government's plan to improve regional connectivity through road and infrastructure development, in-tandem attention is being paid to socio-economic uplift of underdeveloped areas. Prime Minister's recent visit to China witnessed signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) under which a number of socio-economic projects will be initiated. These projects, which have been developed in consultation with the Balochistan government's officials, aim to have high impact, short gestation period and high visibility. Under the MoU, a number of projects have been reviewed and finalized by the Chinese government across a diverse set of sectors such as agriculture, education, medicine, poverty alleviation, water supply and vocational training.

Bostan Special Economic Zone (SEZ)

Development of Bostan SEZ will augment industrialization, facilitate international industrial cooperation and encourage provincial business activity to move up the value-added chain across myriad sectors. This initiative will generate jobs, and have spillover effect in upstream supply chain across the province leading to improved economic activity. Some of the industrial sectors expected to be in Bostan SEZ may comprise of fruit processing, agriculture machinery, pharmaceutical, ceramics, electric appliances amongst others.

Besides, development of coastal tourism is part of CPEC development plan and represents a promising area for investment which will lead to employment generation and economic activity for the people of Balochistan.

The aforementioned encompass a wide spectrum of initiatives from infrastructure development, better connectivity, improved civic facilities, to softer interventions such as socio-economic programs. It is expected that a well-diversified, sizable investment thesis as mentioned above will lead to a reduction of economic and social disparity within the regions of Balochistan and bring it at par with other provinces as well.

(c) The Government of Balochistan (GoB) is kept onboard while taking any decision with respect to development plans and projects of the province. Chief Minister, Balochistan is a regular participant of Joint Cooperation Committee (JCC) meetings. Similarly, Chief Secretary Balochistan co-chairs the Joint Working Group (JWG) on Gwadar. Representatives of the GoB are also members in relevant JWGs pertaining to socio-economic development under CPEC. Further, socio-economic projects which were short-listed and finalized were proposed, reviewed and developed by the GoB; Special Economic Zone (SEZ) location was also selected by the GoB. As such the GoB is involved in all key decisions and progress/execution matters related to CPEC projects in the province.

Minister for Finance, Revenue and Economic Affairs: (a) Yes, as it is one of the FATF's standard and an international practice that Financial Institutional Unit (FIU) of any country can share information between members of the Egmont Group-a united body of 159 FIUs, which provides a forum for Intelligence Units to improve cooperation in the fight against money laundering and terrorist financing. In this regard, Federal Cabinet has already given approval to initiate the process of membership of the Egmont Group on 21-09-2011. After approval of the Cabinet, FMU initiated the due process for seeking membership of Egmont Group. At present, Onsite Assessment Report (OAR) from FinCEN (FIU of USA) and JAFIC (FIU of Japan) is still awaited which describes findings of Onsite visit to Pakistan undertaken from January 29, 2018 to February 02, 2018.

(b) The Egmont membership process consists of following eight steps:

- Step 1: Application-An Expression of Interest (EOI) should be submitted to the Executive Secretary of the Egmont Group Secretariat (EGS)-**Done**
- Step 2: Identifying Sponsor FIUs-**Done** (FinCEN and JAFIC are two co-sponsors for FMU's membership in Egmont Group)
- Step 3: Monitoring Phase-(The monitoring process by the Sponsors will include reviewing the information provided in the EOI and collecting basic information such as additional contact details, confirming the level of interest from the FIU in joining the Egmont Group, any additional information on the status and operation of the FIU and any further relevant legislation or regulatory material).**Done**
- Step 4: Preparation for the final Onsite Visit-**Done**
- Step 5: Final Onsite Visit (During the onsite visit the Sponsors and applicant FIU will discuss the relevant operational issues)-**Done**
- Step 6: After the Final Onsite Visit (After the final onsite visit the Sponsors will produce an onsite Assessment Report (OAR), which describes their findings and addresses the issues raised in the previous steps.

The report should present a clear conclusion expressing whether or not the applicant FIU meets the legal and operational status criteria for membership consideration, and must remain confidential and not be disclosed to the applicant FIU).

Step 7: Invitation to the Applicant FIU to Attend the Egmont Plenary (The Sponsor FIUs recommend that the Egmont Group invite an applicant FIU to attend an Egmont Group Plenary session).

Step 8: Acceptance by the Heads of FIUs (Subject to the Heads of FIUs endorsing the recommendation of the Membership, Support and Compliance Working Group (MSCWG), the applicant becomes a full Egmont Group member FIU. Membership shall be effective upon committing in writing to the Egmont Group Charter)

Awareness and Advocacy

1. National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) has taken various initiatives to exploit print, electronic and digital media forums for Disaster Risk Mitigation (DRM) and therefore, devised an electronic Advocacy & Awareness Campaigns. The tools used for educating people on DRM include; posters, booklets, radio & television talk shows, radio spots, documentaries and lectures.

2. 8th October has been notified as National Disaster Awareness Day since year 2015. This Day was re-notified as National Disaster Resilience Day in 2017. This Day is commemorated to include City branding, Flag March of Emergency Services, Cyclathon, Public Event/ ceremony in Parks.

3. To engage youth and students as ambassadors for disaster awareness and adaptation, in 2017 NDMA launched an Infotainment Game Show 'TAYYAR PAKISTAN' (Ready Pakistan). The Infotainment Game Show was recorded in four episodes and a Grand finale. Twelve teams of secondary school students from all across Pakistan participated and it was aired on PTV Home.

4. NDMA has developed a library of fourteen (14) public service TV Commercial (TVCS) of short duration, aired on various TV channels.

5. Dynamic website with Global viewership and Alerting Capability is put in place. Website has Knowledge Resource in the form of publications etc.

6. NDMA has developed two documentaries; 'Towards a Disaster Resilient Pakistan' and 'Vulnerable Groups in Disasters'. These documentaries

are displayed at important events, international conferences and seminars and are much appreciated by audience.

7. Child centered and gender sensitive IEC (Information, Education and Communication) material designed.

8. A number of National and provincial level Media Training Workshops on responsible media reporting during disasters at Karachi, Lahore, Islamabad and Peshawar during 2016.

9. Seven TV/Radio Programms of 40 minutes duration on Flash Floods, fire hazard, droughts etc. have been prepared that cover all types of natural and man-made disasters, and are aired from time to time.

10. A complete social media constellation is formed, maintained and promoted to include Facebook, Twitter and Flickr Accounts.

11. Pakistan School Safety Framework is an exemplary initiative of NDMA that ensure safety of young children at schools in the event of an emergency situation. This is a countrywide program wherein teachers, students and schools administrations are sensitized on the possibility of an emergency situation in school and trained to cope up with such emergencies.

12. NDMA's National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM) conducts regular training for capacity building and awareness raising of all stakeholders. It has so far trained 7759 number of officers /officials.

Will the Minister In-charge of the Prime Minister's Office be pleased to state:

- (a) *the performance of national disaster management plan 2013-2022 for last three years; and*
- (b) *whether national disaster management plan 2013-2022 has been successful in achieving its objective; if so, the detail thereof?*

Minister In-charge of the Prime Minister's Office:

- (a) **National Disaster Management Plan (NDMP 2012 – 2022).**

Under the Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) policy parameters and in-line with the provision of NDM Act 2010, NDMA formulated a prospective

ten years National Disaster Management Plan (NDMP 2012-22) and got it approved by the National Disaster Management Commission, (NDMC) in its meeting held on 21st February, 2013. This Plan chalks out a number of projects and strategies at a cost of 2040 Million USD (after finalization of National Flood Protection Plan - NFPP-IV) and is to be completed in 10 years time frame.

Performance of NDMP. The performance of NDMP in last 3 years may be ascertained by the activities undertaken in line with the Implementation Framework and are broadly highlighted below:—

- a. Legislative Review of the existing Acts was carried out **(Annex-I)**.
- b. Institutional strengthening / capacity enhancement of Disaster Management Authorities was undertaken **(Annex-II)**.
- c. A number of Policies/ Plans/ Guidelines related to disaster management were made and circulated with all concerned **(Annex-III)**.
- d. Capacity Building Trainings & Simulation Exercises were conducted through the National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM), a Statutory Organization of NDMA **(Annex-IV)**.
- e. After completion of the Multi Hazard Vulnerability Risk Assessment (MHVRA) at Macro level, MHVRA at micro level *i.e.* down to UC level has commenced. **(Annex-V)**.
- f. Awareness and Advocacy campaigns were conducted throughout the year. As part of Global and National commitment, NDMA also commemorated National Resilience Day on 8th October and National Disaster Awareness Day on 13 October every year. **(Annex-VI)**.
- g. Community Resilience is continuously being enhanced through different activities **(Annex-VII)**

(b) There have been reasonable successes achieved as explained above, despite resource constraints which can further be enhanced through a resource backed NDMP implementation plan to build disaster resilient Pakistan. In order to realign the NDMP with the futuristic and latest International Framework “Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR)”, negotiations have been done with Japanese International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and Government of Balochistan. Accordingly, NDMP is being revised to meet international standards.
