## RESOLUTION

Mr. Jam Abdul Karim Bijar, MNA, moved the following resolution, which was adopted by the House:-

“that.

**Subject: Recognition of Former Prime Minister Shaheed Zulfikar Ali Bhutto as a National Martyr**

Whereas, Shaheed Zulfikar Ali Bhutto, the founder of the Pakistan People's Party, former President, and former Prime Minister of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, made outstanding contributions to the political, democratic, social, and nuclear strength of the country; Whereas, his efforts for national unity, empowerment of the common people, strengthening of democratic institutions, and establishment of Pakistan's independent foreign policy are widely acknowledged;

Whereas, on 4th April 1979, Shaheed Zulfikar Ali Bhutto was executed following a judicial process that has since been widely criticized nationally and internationally, and recently the Honorable Supreme Court of Pakistan has observed that he did not receive a fair trial;

Whereas, millions of Pakistani citizens regard him as a national leader who laid down his life for the cause of democracy and people's rights;

Now, therefore, this House resolves and recommends to the Federal Government that:

1. Shaheed Zulfikar Ali Bhutto be officially declared as a National Martyr (“Shaheed”).
2. The Federal Government issue an official notification recognizing his martyrdom in the national historical and democratic record.
3. Relevant federal institutions, educational syllabus and archives reflect his contributions and services for the nation accordingly.
