59. ***Mr. Attaullah:**
(Deferred during 39th Session)

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state:

- (a) *the number of consumer courts in Islamabad; and*
(b) *the number of cases which are pending in said courts?*

30. ***Ms. Nusrat Wahid:**
(Deferred during 41st Session)

Will the Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination be pleased to state the steps being taken by the Government to improve the sports, games and encourage our youth to play sports in the country?

Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination (Mr. Ehsan-ur-Rehman Mazari): M/o Sports has been devolved in the wake of 18th Constitutional Amendment and resources have been shifted to provinces under NFC Award. The province have now a handsome sports budget which can be utilized for establishing academies, nurseries and making sports mandatory in schools besides development of sports infrastructure. Despite limited resources, Pakistan Sports Board is organizing training camps, providing foreign training to athletes, hiring the services of foreign qualified coaches and providing necessary financial assistance. The provinces should play their role to prepare an athlete from grassroots level.

The Government is taking following steps for effective and result-oriented coordination of Federations and sporting bodies so as to promote the sports and also improve performance of athletes in the country:

- (1) **Revision of National Sports Policy:** It will restructure sports governance system, foster sports culture; promote sports at the grassroots level, prepare players for better performance and develop sports tourism in the country.
 - (2) **Revision of Constitution of PSB:** It will make PSB dynamic and vibrant organization, enabling it to regulate NSF's in an effective manner.
 - i. **Restructurings of PSB:** It will address the challenges of poor human capital, low skill set and shortage of human resources for managerial positions.
 - ii. **Elite Athlete Pool:** is being already developed so that the athletes can be directly funded and looked after to continue their training. We will brand them and invite private sector for their sponsorship.
 - (3) A Federal Sports Coordination Committee (FSCC) has been constituted under the chair of Federal Minister for IPC and have issued following directions to provinces:
 - (a) Establishment of Tehsil level multiple-purpose Sports infrastructure.
 - (b) Sports is to be made mandatory at school level.
32. ***Syed Agha Rafiullah:**

Will the Minister for Defence be pleased to state:

- (a) *the Ministry has recently procured the services of a testing service, namely www.recruitments.com.pk, which was recently advertised, through bidding to fill various posts of different cadres;*
- (b) *if so, the details of the process that was adopted to finalize the selection of the said testing service;*

- (c) *whether it is also a fact that such testing services have been asking the applicants to deposit a certain amount alongwith the application for each post; if so, the details thereof;*
- (d) *the standard for fixing of such a fee;*
- (e) *whether it was necessary to collect any amount from applicants, have the concerned authorities taken into account the decision of the Superior Courts which obliges equal distribution of such fee between applicants and the recruiting Ministry;*
- (f) *if so, details thereof and justification for receiving such money from already unemployed people; and*
- (g) *what corrective measures are being taken by the Government to rectify any discrepancies found either hiring of testing services or charging such amount from applicants?*

Minister for Defence (Khawaja Muhammad Asif): (a) It is clarified that www.recruitments.com.pk is not a testing service. It is a website being managed by MoD for advertising, result intimation, etc.

(c) Testing fee is being received from applicants to manage testing expenses being incurred during selection process. Bare minimum expenses are collected from applicants keeping in view their financial hardships.

- (a) *the number of employees of Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) working on contract basis and the tenure of their contract during the last three years;*

Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination (Mr. Ehsan-ur-Rehman Mazari): (a) PCB has 325 employees on board on contractual basis. The list is at Annex-A.

(b) Services of contractual employees are regularized as per requirement of the board and as per conduct of the employees.

(c) It is not a fact that the services of most employees have not been regularized. PCB has already started the process of regularizing those employees who have been in PCB for more than 4 years and their age is less than 50 years and their record is clean.

Will the Minister for State and Frontier Regions be pleased to state:

- (a) total achievements of the Ministry in each of the subjects, as are assigned under the Rules of Business, 1973 alongwith the budget allocated, released and used for each subject during each financial year for the three years;*
- (b) whether the Ministry has received any financial assistance in the form of funds during the said period;*
- (c) if so, the details thereof and in what type of work such aid has been used; and*

- (d) *whether the use of such financial aid has been audited; if so, details thereof; and if not, the reasons thereof?*

Minister for State and Frontier Regions (Muhammad Talha Mehmood): (a) • The subjects of “Affairs of former States” and “Afghan Refugees” have been assigned to the Ministry of States & Frontier Regions under the Rules of Business 1973. In addition to responding to legal issues of former States, this Ministry releases maintenance allowance to the ex-rulers and their dependents under the policy provided by the President Order No.15 called "The Rulers of Acceding States (Abolition of Privy Privileges) order 1972. The detailed maintenance allowance to ex-Rulers of Acceded States for the years 2019 to 2022 is as under:-

- Management, registration, care and maintenance of Afghan Refugees is being dealt with by a separate ‘Afghan Refugees Wing’ of the Ministry in close coordination with the UNHCR, concerned Federal ministries and Provincial Departments.
- For the purpose of policy update and implementation of Afghan refugees mandates, an attached department (executive department) namely Chief Commissionerate for Afghan Refugees (CCAR) is established and stationed in Islamabad. Under Chief Commissionerates are the offices of Commissionerates for Afghan Refugees (CARs) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Balochistan & Punjab and an Afghan Refugees Repatriation Cell (ARRC) in Karachi. They are set up for coordinating efforts to manage the temporary stay of Afghan refugees in Pakistan and their repatriation on voluntary basis to their homeland under tripartite agreement signed between Afghanistan, Pakistan and UNHCR.
- The major activities during the period from 2019 to 2021 are as under:-

Inter-Ministerial Working Group on Afghan Refugees:

- Ministry of States and Frontier Regions led the the Inter-Ministerial Working Group to respond to the evolving situation in Afghanistan in 2021 and to meet the challenges of potential of influx Afghans and security situation in border areas.

Documentation of Un- registered Afghans

- Successfully and effectively concluded Afghan citizen Card (ACC) exercise by distributing ACC cards to the newly documented Afghans who were residing in Pakistan without any identity and were pose potential threat for security.

6th Meeting of Quadripartite Steering Committee:

- Organized and hosted 6th Meeting of Quadripartite Steering Committee (Q-4), at Islamabad on June 17, 2019, participated by Govt. of IR of Iran, Govt. of IR of Afghanistan and UNHCR wherein all parties agreed to continue with Solution Strategy for Afghan Refugees (SSAR) till Dec 31, 2021. The SSAR is a regional strategy that emphasise on a) Voluntary Repatriation from Pakistan, b) Sustainable Reintegration in Afghanistan and c) Assistance to Host Countries.

30th Tripartite Commission Meeting:

- During 30th Tripartite Commission Meeting held at Islamabad on 18th June, 2019, the Govt. of Pakistan, Govt. of Afghanistan and UNHCR urged International community for increasing support for voluntary repatriation and multi-sectoral facilitation for Afghan refugees and their host communities.

Afghanistan Pakistan Action Plan for Peace & Solidarity (APAPPS) Meetings:

- The most important initiative was taken by the Government of Pakistan during the year 2019 when Afghanistan Pakistan Action Plan for Peace & Solidarity (APAPPS) was constituted that is the primary forum for wide-ranging discussion between Afghanistan and Pakistan. Under this plan five

working group have been constituted including working group on Afghan refugees repatriation. SAFRON/CCAR office attended a number of meetings during the last three years and 1st time on 7th November, 2018 the Govt. of Afghanistan agreed for road map for return of all categories of Afghans from Pakistan.

Opening Bank Account

- During the year 2019, the Govt. of Pakistan under special dispensation has allowed registered Afghan Refugees (POR card holders) to open bank accounts so that this facility may boost their trades/ businesses and ease their daily life requirements. **Up to 31st March, 2022, total 9997 Accounts have been opened by POR card holders and PKR. 1,368 Million deposited/balance in these accounts.**

Voluntary Repatriation

- During the period under report *i.e* from 2019-2021, total 7,796 individuals (POR holders) and 48,957 individuals (un-documented) Afghans have voluntarily returned to their country.
- The Repatriation trend is observed slow due to covid -19 and un conducive environment inside Afghanistan.

SOPs for Refugees Villages /Camps:

- SOPs for Refugees Villages /Camps reviewed and revised the SOPs for better management at refugees Camps and other Refugees' related facilities through detailed mapping of health, educational, waters supply/sanitation, livelihood and community services for efficient and effective monitoring/ reporting systems.

Co- Convener of Global Refugee Forum

- A delegation of Government of Pakistan, being the co-convener of the event had actively participated the Global Refugees Forum (GRF) held on December 17-18, 2019 at Geneva. For responsibility and burden sharing under Global Compact of Refugees, the participants emphasized the need to

strengthen the existing partnerships and to forge new ones to broaden and diversify the base of support through engagement of non-traditional donors, development agencies, private sector and other relevant stakeholders.

Launching Support Platform

- The delegation of Ministry of SAFRON led by minister for SAFRON have attended the inaugural event on launch of "Support Platform" under Solution Strategy for Afghan Refugees (SSAR) on December 16, 2019. Under this mechanism traditional, non-traditional, donors along with international Financial, Humanitarian, UN, Corporate sector, private businesses and private individuals are being approached for their support.

International Conference on Refugees

- The International Conference on Refugees was held on Feb 2020 for the first time in the last 40 years in Islamabad. In the event the Afghan Refugees issue was highlighted at the Global level. The event was well attended with very high level participation from almost all the countries, where Pakistan's role as a generous host was appreciated and global community was urged to do much more for settling the Afghan Refugees issue and on burden and responsibility.

DRIVE Exercise

- Revalidation and re-verification exercise for Afghan Refugees was undertaken by SAFRON with full funding and assistance from UNHCR. The exercise has been carried out after 10 years, with introduction of highly secured Chip-based smart cards for Afghan Refugees. The upgraded, enriched data has gathered and few fields of information are added, which will help GOP in better planning, management and repatriation of Afghan refugees to their home country. The new data also shows family linkages with existing and undocumented family members of the card holders and their movement in last 10 years.

Facilitation for Afghans

- Pakistan is in constant touch with Afghan officials and organization in Afghanistan to know what are their manpower and skills requirements in their country. Based on that information, SAFRON/CCAR is continuously and successfully working on imparting technical and skills training to Afghan refugees, so that when they go back to find jobs easily and could contribute to the development and prosperity of the home country.

Covid-19 pandemic relief activities

- All Afghan refugees were looked after in the best possible manner during Covid-19 pandemic, which still continues. By successfully negotiating with donors, GOP distributed Rs. 12000 per family to more than 75000 refugee families and also distributed 25000 ration bags. SAFRON also helped KP and Baluchistan to get 19 latest ambulances, thousands of personal protection equipments and other medical equipment for assisting them in their efforts under covid-19 emergencies to cater for both the locals and the refugees.
- The strenuous efforts made by CCAR/Ministry of SAFRON, Government of Pakistan has also included Afghan Citizen Card holders in its vaccination programs besides registered Afghan Refugees . The International Organization IOM was taken on board and after series of meeting with them the ACC card holders were also facilitated by giving cash grant.

Establishment Media Advisory/Guidance Cell and Facilitation Centers:

- Media Advisory/Guidance Cells and Facilitation centres to apprise Afghan Refugees/ACC holders on developments in Afghanistan and Govt. of Pakistan's policies on Refugee Management and Repatriation were established at CCAR office.
- A number of meetings with Afghan Elders from camps and outside camps have been held to disseminate the information among Afghan community regarding government initiatives for Afghan Refugees.

Meetings of Friends of SSAR

- SAFRON/CCAR office has attended several meetings of Friends of SSAR hosted by EU, USA, German & Japan Ambassador and Australian High Commissioner during from 2018 to 2021 and highlighted the Afghan Refugees' issues for burden and responsibilities sharing.
 - Details of budget and expenditure/ appropriation accounts from 2019-22 with year break up is placed at **Annex-A.**
- (b) • The Chief Commissionerate alongwith Provincial Commissionerates of Afghan Refugees have two source of funding i.e.
- (i) Federal Government released by Finance Division
 - (ii) UNHCR Funding through Partner Project agreement.
- (c) • Funds are allocated for administrative and operational expenses to manage and repatriate Afghan refugees living in Pakistan. The major activities have already been elaborated in response at point (a) of the Question. Detail of funds is at Annex- B.
- (d) • The CCAR/CARs' operational and administrative funds are being audited on regular basis by Auditor General of Pakistan Federal Audit and UNHCR carries out verification exercise of these funds quarterly.

- (a) what are the obstacles being faced by the Federal Government in resolving the reasons given in answer of Starred Question No.13 dated 22-12-2021 for not winning any medal in the Olympics;*
- (b) whether it is a fact that sports federations whose athletes competed in the Olympics directly or indirectly under the purview of the Federal Government;*
- (c) if so, whether it is not a failure of respective departments to play its role in promoting sports in the country and instead of fulfilling its responsibilities, the Federal Government is shifting its burden to the provinces;*
- (d) if the subject of sports has been devolved to the provinces, then how is the Federal Government formulating a national sports policy; and*
- (e) whether the provinces have been taken on board or not?*

Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination (Mr. Ehsan-ur-Rehman Mazari): (a) In past, there was no Sports Governance Structure and no regulatory framework for the National Sports Federations (NSFs) and sports bodies. They were neither providing audit statements nor sharing information regarding selection of athletes and teams to Pakistan Sports Board. Furthermore, most of the NSFs are not registered under Law of the land. The non-existence to the state mentioned effective mechanism led us.

After 18th amendment, the provinces are mainly responsible for development of sports and its related infrastructure and provision of other facilities at grass root level.

A comprehensive and vibrant regulatory framework and structured sports governance system in the country has been devised by promulgating PSB Constitution and also revising the existing National Sports Policy, which shall definitely change the sports scenario of Pakistan.

(b) National Sports Federations (NSF) are autonomous organizations governed under their respective Constitutions by their General Councils. Selection of athletes and teams is the sole prerogative of the NSF and participation in international sports events. In past there was no mechanism to regulate the NSF and there was no check and balance / oversight on them. However regulatory framework to regulate the Federations in accordance with rules and law has been formulated.

(c) M/o sports has been devolved in the wake of 18th Constitutional Amendment and resources have been shifted to provinces under NFC Award. The province have now a handsome sports budget which can be utilized for establishing academies, nurseries and making sports mandatory in schools besides development of sports infrastructure. Despite limited resources, the Pakistan Sports Board is organizing training camps, providing foreign training to athletes, hiring the services of foreign qualified coaches and providing necessary financial assistance. The provinces should play their role to prepare an athlete from grassroots level.

(d) The Sports in the country is being regulated and managed under the provisions of the Sports (Development and Control) Ordinance, 1962 which is protected under Article 268 of the Constitution. The said Ordinance empowers the Federal Government to approve and implement the National Sports Policy for uniformity and regulating NSFs & POA.

Sport is the provincial subject in India but the central government makes policy and regulates sports bodies. The Supreme Court of Pakistan and Lahore High Court judgments also validated the powers of the Federal Government in this regard.

(e) Yes. Not only all the provinces including Gilgit Baltistan, AJ&K, also all the major stakeholders *i.e.* Sports Organization/ Federations, Higher Education Commission, Sports Directorates of Pakistan Armed Forces were taken on board during the process of formulating National Sports Policy.

Minister for Overseas Pakistanis and Human Resource Development (Mr. Sajid Hussain Turi): At present, there are approximately 8.9 million Overseas Pakistanis across the world. Country – wise detail of the same is placed at **Annex-I**. On the other hand, more than 11.85 million Pakistani workers have been registered for overseas employment from 1971 to 2022 (up to March). County-wise detail of the same is placed at **Annex-II**.

Minister for Defence (Khawaja Muhammad Asif): (a) The Preliminary Planning Permission (PPP) has been approved for Fazaia Housing Scheme, Kamra. The requisite town planning and layout plan of the scheme has been completed. However, plot numbers and allotment letters will be issued after final approval by District Administration Attock, Govt of Punjab.

(b) Sale/Purchase of plots in said society is subject to approval by District Administration Attock. There is no ban imposed by any district agency on sale/purchase of plots, however, formal permission for sale/purchase would be given once official approval by District Management has been granted.

- (c) Same as (b) above.

58. **Mrs. Shahida Akhtar Ali:**
(Deferred during 39th Session)

Will the Minister for Defence be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that an employees who dies during service is given a plot under Family Assistance Package and; if plot is not available, his family is given an amount equal to the price of the plot;*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that the Federal Ombudsman ordered through WMS in complaint No.HQR/0002010/18 dated August 10, 2018, that a plot be allotted to the family of Manzoor Hussain (Late), Ticket No.1187, being an ex-employees of COD Rawalpindi, Ministry of Defence;*
- (c) *whether it is further a fact that his family has not been allotted a plot as yet;*
- (d) *if the answer to both the parts above is in affirmative, why plot has not been allotted to the widow of the said employees alongwith the reasons for the delay; and*

(e) *the time by which a plot or an amount equal to its price will be given to the widow?*

Minister for Defence (Khawaja Muhammad Asif): (a) Mr. Manzoor Hussain, Ticket No. 1187, ex-employee of COD / Rawalpindi, under administrative control of Ordnance Directorate GHQ, Ministry of Defence died during service on 17-12-2005. At that time no Family Assistance Package was in vogue. Assistance Package for Families of Government Employees Who Die in Service was issued vide Establishment Division O.M. No. 7/40/2005-E-2 dated 13-06-2006. However, Establishment Division later on clarified vide O.M. No. 7/40/2005-E-2 dated 11-07-2006 that above O.M. would be applicable from 01-07-2005. However, assistance cases already decided would not be re-opened. As per provision contained in Assistance Package of 2006, 2% quota was fixed for deceased employees for allotment of a plot as per FGEHF (Federal Govt Employees Housing Foundation) policy. However, there is no provision for grant of an amount equal to the price of the plot to the family of deceased, if plot is not available, in the assistance package 2006.

(b) No order has been received in Civil Personnel Directorate, GHQ from Federal Ombudsman. However, after liaison with Ordnance Directorate, GHQ and Central Ordnance Depot Rawalpindi, the application of widow for allotment of plot was forwarded to FGEHF Islamabad vide Central Ordnance Depot Rawalpindi letter number 2179/Fin dated 13-10-2017 (Copy attached as per **Annexure A**).

(c) Responsibility for allotment of plot rests with FGEHF. In the light of information received from Central Ordnance Depot Rawalpindi, family of Manzoor Hussain ex-employee of Central Ordnance Depot Rawalpindi has not been allotted any plot.

(d) As highlighted above, responsibility of allotment of plot solely falls under the purview of FGEHF as per their policy and FGEHF is an independent department which is not under administrative control of GHQ, Ministry of Defence.

(f) The widow may approach FGEHF and get membership/registered with them and plot will be allotted by them as per their own policy on seniority basis.

Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination (Mr. Ehsan-ur-Rehman Mazari): (a) At the outset it is pointed out that the PCB is a body corporate having perpetual succession and has been established as a Board under Sports (Development and Control) Ordinance 1962 by the Federal Government through S.R.O No. 1045 (I)/2019, notified on 19th

August 2019 (*i.e.* the PCB Constitution). PCB operates and functions through its Board of Governors, who are fully empowered to formulate rules and regulations. PCB being an autonomous entity, through its Board of Governors, generates its own revenues and neither takes nor receives any grants or funds from the Government or Public Exchequer. In fact it submits millions in the form of applicable taxes.

Niaz Stadium Hyderabad was forcibly taken over from PCB by Municipal Committee Qasimabad Hyderabad on 2nd April, 2018. As a consequence PCB has removed man power and equipment etc. from Niaz Stadium as it is no longer under PCB's control.

(b) PCB does not have control over Niaz Stadium Hyderabad as mentioned above.

(c) At the moment, Niaz Stadium Hyderabad is not in a condition to host high profile matches. The PCB may consider scheduling international games if the stadium is renovated to such a level.

Will the Minister for Overseas Pakistanis and Human Resources Development be pleased to state the total number of labour force working in gulf countries?
