(Deferred during 27<sup>th</sup> Session)**

**Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:**

- a) whether it is a fact that, on the eve of anticipated increases in petroleum prices during the months of March and April 2026, several filling stations deliberately curtailed the sale of petroleum products on fabricated pretexts such as alleged bank system link failures in order to create artificial shortages;**
- b) if so, whether the relevant regulatory authorities have taken immediate notice of this malpractice;**
- c) what concrete enforcement actions were taken against those involved;**
- d) whether the Government has received any complaints in this regard from the public or other stakeholders, and if so, the details thereof;**
- e) whether any penalties, fines were imposed or disciplinary measures were taken against on the filling stations found involved in such malpractice; and**
- f) what corrective and preventive measures the Government is taking to protect the common citizen from artificial shortages, hoarding, and exploitation in the future?**

**Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz):** (a) On the eve of weekly petroleum price revisions, particularly in first week of March, 2026, panic buying and an unusually large influx of consumers was observed with at some filling stations. However, such reported instances were immediately communicated to concerned Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) for quick redressal through OGRA's coordination group established with all OMCs, and necessary follow-up action was undertaken to ensure timely resolution of public grievances. Further, complaints regarding alleged bank system/link failures were resolved through concerned OMCs.

(b) Yes. OGRA immediately issued strict directions to all Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) to ensure uninterrupted supply of petroleum products at notified rates and to strengthen field monitoring at their respective retail outlets. Furthermore, in OGRA we receive public complaints regarding any short selling, hoarding, dry-outs, and overcharging of petroleum products for timely redressal through the concerned OMCs.

(c) OGRA, in coordination with the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) and Intelligence Bureau (IB), initiated a comprehensive inspection regime covering 25 locations nationwide. Fortnightly Inspections are being conducted at 135 OMC depots, refinery installations, and third-party storages, to verify physical stocks of Motor Spirit (MS), High-Speed Diesel (HSD), and crude oil against reported inventories. The routine enforcement and subsequent redressals are in addition to it.

(d) Yes, some complaints were received from public through a dedicated complaint cell established by OGRA. The complaints were mainly received telephonically regarding restricted supplies. All such complaints were promptly communicated to the concerned OMCs for immediate redressal through OGRA's WhatsApp coordination group established with all OMCs, and necessary follow-up action was undertaken to ensure timely resolution of public grievances.

(e) OGRA through its six regional offices conducted field enforcement activities at the OMCs' filling stations in coordination with District authorities and OMCs' representatives to address public complaints regarding overcharging and sales stoppage. On-spot actions including site sealing, sales restoration and penalty imposition were undertaken by the District Authorities.

(f) To protect consumers from artificial shortages, hoarding, and exploitation, OGRA has issued strict directions to all Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) to ensure uninterrupted supply of petroleum products at notified rates and to strengthen field monitoring at retail outlets. Simultaneously, Deputy Commissioners and Provincial Chief Secretaries were engaged to undertake regular inspections and maintain strict vigilance against hoarding, profiteering, illegal storage, and related malpractices.

**Will the Minister for Parliamentary Affairs be pleased to state:**

- a) how the Government reconciles the Lahore High Court's directives compelling the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) to conduct Punjab local Government Elections within 45 days after the court noted the ECP had failed to provide verifiable security threat evidence to justify postponement with the ECP's own assessment that holding polls under current conditions could compromise safety;**
- b) whether the court has demanded a compliance report by April 15, 2026 and warned of contempt proceedings for non-compliance what institutional coordination has been established between the Law Ministry and ECP to align judicial deadlines with security realities; and**
- c) how will the Ministry facilitate the ECP's request for additional resources and personnel to conduct elections within the constituency mandated timeframe?**

**Minister for Parliamentary Affairs (Dr. Tariq Fazal Chaudhary):** (a) The Lahore High Court has not issued any such direction to the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) to conduct Local Government Elections in the Punjab Province within 45 days and no copy of the alleged order of the High Court has been received in this Commission and the copy of the same has also not been provided with the question. The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) has not taken any plea before the Lahore High Court seeking postponement of Local Government Elections on any grounds, including security reasons.

(b) The Court has not demanded compliance report therefore question of compliance does not arise. However, order of the Hon'ble Lahore High Court Lahore dated 15.04.2026 is also enclosed.

(c) ECP has not requested for additional resources and personnel at this stage for the conduct of L.G elections. However, at the time of election the Federal and Provincial Governments assist and provide resources as per the requirement and mandate of Commission. It is further added that Under Article 140-A (1) of the Constitution each Province is empowered to establish by law a Local Government System and under Article 140-A (2) elections to the Local Government shall be held by the ECP. Article 140-A is reproduced hereunder:

*“[140A. (1) Each Province shall, by law, establish a local government system and devolve administrative and political, financial responsibility and authority to the elected representatives of the local governments. (2) Elections to the local governments shall be held by the Election Commission of Pakistan.]”*

Term of Local Government in Punjab was expired on 31.12.2021. Since 2019, the successive Provincial Governments of Punjab has enacted six (06) Local Government Laws from time to time. The detail is as under:

- i. On 4<sup>th</sup> May, 2019, two new acts "Punjab Local Government Act, 2019" and "Punjab Village Panchayats & Neighborhood Councils Act, 2019" were enacted.
- ii. On 3<sup>rd</sup> February, 2021, amendments were made in Punjab Local Government Act, 2019 and Punjab Village Panchayats & Neighborhood Councils Act, 2019 was repealed by virtue of "Punjab Local Government (Amendment) Ordinance, 2021;
- iii. On 11<sup>th</sup> December, 2021, an Ordinance "the Punjab Local Government Ordinance, 2021" was promulgated.
- iv. On 24<sup>th</sup> June, 2022, another law i.e. "Punjab Local Government Act, 2022" was enacted.
- v. On 16<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 another law "Punjab Local Government Act, 2022" was enacted.

On 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2025 (6) sixth new law i.e. the "Punjab Local Government Act 2025" was enacted. The Election Commission has issued five (05) delimitation schedules (Annex-1) under the above stated applicable Local Government Laws Delimitation process was completed twice in 2022 and 2023. The process of enlistment of Electoral Groups was completed twice (Annex-II). The Election Program (Annex-III) was also issued on 14<sup>th</sup> April, 2022. The same was suspended by the Lahore High Court Multan Bench.

Now, the Government of Punjab has enacted the Punjab Local Government Act, 2025. The essential data to carry-out the delimitation process have been provided by the Government of Punjab to ECP. The ECP has issued delimitation schedule on 15<sup>th</sup> April, 2026 (sixth time) (Annex-IV) under the newly enacted the Punjab Local Government Act, 2025 and the final list of Constituencies will be published on 10<sup>th</sup> August 2026. Election Commission is committed to conduct Local Government Elections in the Province of Punjab as per constitutional and legal mandate.

**Will the Minister for Foreign Affairs be pleased to state:**

- a) **what steps are being taken by the Government to address the dire plight of Pakistanis Prisoners, especially those on death row, seriously ill or due to heavy fine in Spain, United Kingdom and Portugal; and**
- b) **the responsiveness of Pakistani Embassies in providing legal and welfare support to thousands of overseas workers?**

**Minister for Foreign Affairs (Senator Mohammad Ishaq Dar): (a)**

- i. As per the Spanish Constitution, capital punishment is abolished.
- ii. The Spanish legal system provides all accused or charged persons with free legal counsel and defense, including in their native language, if they are unable to afford legal representation. Convictions are made only after the completion of due process of law, and those convicted are provided avenues for appeal. Consequently, our Missions in Spain do not ordinarily receive requests for assistance with legal representation.
- iii. Nevertheless, our Mission is providing full legal support and counseling when approached by any individual. It must also be clarified that, after conviction, prisoners are required to serve their sentences as decreed, and there are no provisions for release contingent upon the payment of fines. There have been no reports of unlawful detention or unjustified imprisonment of Pakistanis in Spain.
- iv. In 2023, our Mission in Madrid, with the approval for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, engaged the services of a law firm (for €19,500) to represent 13 Pakistani mariners arrested from M/V Blume for trafficking 4,400 kg of drugs.

**Portugal:**

- i. Our Mission in Lisbon regularly provides consular access to the prisoners. It bridges coordination between prisoners and their lawyers, on need basis. Our Mission has provided essential items and halal food to prisoners, after consultation with jail authorities.
- ii. As a major step MOFA has initiated a proposal for signing of an agreement on transfer of offenders between Pakistan and Portugal, so that the convicted prisoners could be able to complete their sentences in their home country.

**United Kingdom**

- i. The UK judicial system operates independently in determining criminal liability and sentencing. Legal presentation is provided to defendants upon request during trial proceedings by the UK government. Following conviction, sentenced individuals are

required to serve their term, though the UK's Early Release Scheme which may permit release based on good conduct. It is important to note that the UK government does not entertain consular intervention seeking the early release of its citizens or foreign nationals.

- ii. The Prisoner Transfer Agreement has facilitated the repatriation of six Pakistani Prisoners in the calendar year 2024 and three prisoners in 2025. Our high Commission in London is actively working on additional five cases for their repatriation 2026.
- iii. With regards to the efforts by our High Commission in London it may be noted that repatriation was resumed following a hiatus of five years. The standard repatriation procedure is as follows:
  - iv. A prisoner submits a formal request for repatriation to UK prison authorities.
  - v. HM Prison and Probation Service forward the application, along with full crime and sentencing details to the FIA Link Officer in the High Commission..
  - vi. The Link Officer transmits the application to MOFA Islamabad for onward submission of the Ministry of Interior.
  - vii. Upon the MOI's confirmation of the prisoners release date and its willingness to accept the prisoner into a Pakistani facility, MOFA notifies the Mission, which in return informs the HMPPS.
  - viii. HMPPS then finalizes all documentation and arranges flight logistics, with flight details and receiving officer information from the FIA in Pakistan confirmed by the MOI.
- (b) i. As soon as a Pakistani is apprehended by the law enforcing agencies, the date of arrest and the charges leveled against them are communicated to the Missions through official communication channels of the host Government. The Missions tabulate the information and a comprehensive databank of the same is maintained.
  - ii. At times, Pakistanis arrested in police stations are released because of the timely intervention of the Missions. Similarly, Missions facilitate release/repatriation of Pakistanis detained/stranded at various airports of the host State.
  - iii. After arrest, the case is sent to Public Prosecution Departments where the facility of translator, if required, is usually provided by the department itself. However, the Missions' officials regularly visit the departments and assist Pakistanis when and where requested.
  - iv. The Mission representatives regularly visit the jails and ensure the well-being of all prisoners. The prisoners interact with the officers of the Missions during jail visits and register their complaints regarding food, medicine, hygiene etc., which are immediately discussed with the jail authorities.
    - v. Contact details of officials, officers and Honorary Representatives of the Missions are provided to every jail. Prisoners contact the Mission on regular basis.
    - vi. The Mission helps in arranging visits of the families of the prisoners on regular basis. A prescribed proforma is issued by the Missions which are honored by the Jail authorities.
    - vii. At times, the families in Pakistan demand that the prisoners wish to sign a power of attorney or other similar document. The officials of the Missions facilitate them in this regard.
  - viii. The Missions regularly obtain data of Pakistani prisoners in jails and deportation centers and provide Emergency Travel Documents to the prisoners who have completed their awarded sentence.
    - ix. Mercy appeals/petitions received from the relatives are forwarded to the concerned State Offices through the host Foreign Office.
    - x. Missions in Gulf States have also opened legal sections to provide free of cost legal consultation.
    - xi. Missions in Muslim countries periodically request the local authorities for waiving off remaining sentences of Pakistani prisoners undergoing imprisonments on various occasions e.g. Ramadan, Eid, and National Days, etc.
    - xii. Cases of prisoners on death row are forwarded to local authorities for converting their death penalty into long imprisonments, where possible.

- xiii. At every high-level visit, the Ministry ensures that the issue of release of Pakistani prisoners is raised with the visiting dignitary in order to repatriate as many Pakistani prisoners possible.

**Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:**

- a) whether it is a fact that consumption of gas is more in the months of June, July 2024 than the consumption in December, 2024 and January 2025; and  
b) if so, the details of consumptions of SNGPL and SSGPL and reasons?

**Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz):** (a) The average consumption of gas in domestic sector in SNGPL and SSGCL's networks in the said months is as follow:

(b) The overall consumption in both Suis networks keeps fluctuating round the year. Generally, the demand is consistent with historical seasonal trends i.e. in winter season, demand increases in domestic sector mainly for space and water heating compare to summer months while on the other hand, power sector demand decreases in winter months and increase during the summer months.

**Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:**

- a) whether the Ministry has reviewed Pakistan's Petroleum Import Bill during the last Fiscal Year; and  
b) the share of imported petroleum in the national energy mix and its impact on foreign exchange reserves?

**Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz):** (a) Yes. Pakistan's Petroleum Import (Crude and Petroleum products) Bill during the last fiscal year 2024-25 remained USD 11.194 billion.

(b) The share of imported petroleum (Crude and Petroleum products) in National Energy Mix corresponds to 39%. The total import bill of Pakistan for the Fiscal year 2024-25 was USD 70.09 billion and the Petroleum imports accounted for 15.9% i.e. USD 11.194 billion. Since, the import of Petroleum constitute a major share of import bill, it adversely impacts the foreign exchange reserves, however, as it is desperately needed to run the economy, the petroleum imports have to be secured.

**Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state:**

- a) how the Ministry justifies the Rs. 22.328 billion cut to the National Highway Authority (NHA) PSDP allocation part of the Government's 10 percent across-the-board reduction to fund fuel subsidies when NHA revenue has increased 63 percent in one year from Rs. 66 billion to Rs. 109 billion, with a projected Rs. 135 billion by June 2026;**
- b) whether the Minister has directed NHA to prepare a regular safety and security plan for all highways;**
- c) tighten the axle load policy, yet the budget cut threatens ongoing projects including the Karachi-Quetta-Chaman Expressway and Karachi-Hyderabad Motorway; and**
- d) details of the projects will be delayed as a result of this reduction?**

**Minister for Communications (Mr. Abdul Aleem Khan):** (a) NHA is a body corporate established through an act of parliament i.e. NHA Act with the mandate to plan, promote, organize and implement programs for construction, development, operation, repair and maintenance of National Highways, Motorways and strategic roads entrusted to the authority. At present, NHA is managing federalized road network of above 14500 KMs of the country.

NHA Act 1991 (Amended 2024) Section-10(2)(vii), Chapter-III authorizes NHA to levy, collect or cause to be collected tolls on National Highways, Motorways & Strategic Roads and such other roads under its control and such terms as it deems fit.

In addition, under Section 6 (Power and functions of National Highway Council) Sub Section 1(b) of the NHA Act. National Highway Council (NHC) is Competent to lay down policies and guidelines to be followed by the Authority in the performance of its functions. Accordingly, Road Maintenance Rules (RMA), 2003 were formulated. Under RMA rules, 2003, following designated sources of receipts have been authorized to NHA:

- i. Tolls on roads and bridges;
- ii. road use related fines (e.g., overloading, traffic offence);
- iii. axle load charges;
- iv. supplementary heavy vehicle fee;
- v. international transit fees; and
- vi. border fees

The revenue collected by NHA through tolling and other sources are credited to the Road Maintenance Account (RMA) and are primarily utilized for the operation and maintenance of the existing road network. Toll revenue is a major contributor to the NHA resource envelope, which is utilized to fund the annual maintenance plan (AMP) for rehabilitation and improvement of the existing road network. PSDP allocations, on the other hand, are dedicated to development purposes, including:

- Construction of new highways and motorways.
- Expansion and upgradation of existing infrastructure

Therefore, RMA receipts including toll revenue cannot substitute PSDP funding, as both serve fundamentally different objectives. While NHA has demonstrated significant improvement in revenue collection from Rs. 66 billion to Rs. 109 billion, with projected receipts of approximately Rs. 128 billion by June 2026. This increase pertains to maintenance and upgradation related funding streams and does not offset the requirement for development financing under PSDP allocations as per the RMA Rules, 2003.

**(b)** The Minister for Communications has consistently emphasized the critical importance of ensuring highway safety and security for road users and commuters. In this regard, necessary directions, including verbal instructions, have been conveyed to the NHA from time to time.

(c) National Highway Safety Ordinance, 2000 (NHSO-2000) provides the legal framework and defines the Axle load limits as per Schedule-VI and procedures permissible on National Highway Network and Motorways. As per NHSO-2000, NHMP is authorized agency for enforcement of the same.

The main function of NHA is to build new roads and also maintains the existing network at the optimum level to provide the best services to the road commuters. Accordingly, NHA has to provide Weigh Station Infrastructures on its road network along with provision of allied facilities like weigh operation contractor and buildings across the country.

**Action by NHA:**

- NHA has provided the infrastructure of 238x Permanent and Mobile weigh stations at strategic locations on National Highways and Motorways.
- No GOP funding is required during fiscal year 2025-26 for newly planned Karachi Port - Hyderabad Motorway (M-10). Following is the status of ongoing process of M-10 Motorway: M/s NESPAK has completed the Detailed Design & Commercial feasibility study.
- Project Cost is to the tune of PKR 511 Billion.
- Project financing is planned through Public Private Partnership (PPP)
- Project PC-1 forwarded to Planning Commission in March 2026.
- Allocation will be required in next fiscal year to undertake the Project.

**Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:**

- a) the salient features of the original agreement executed with K-Electric including subsequent amendments, particularly obligations regarding generation capacity, investment, and service delivery;
- b) the existing installed capacity of K-Electric and the extent of its indigenous generation vis-a-vis reliance on external supply;
- c) whether K-Electric has fulfilled its contractual obligations; if not, the reasons for deviations thereof;
- d) whether expansion of generation, transmission, and distribution infrastructure has been undertaken or is planned; if so, details and timelines thereof;
- e) the reasons for continued outages and load-shedding despite stated capacity;
- f) the measures taken by the Government to ensure uninterrupted and equitable electricity supply; and
- g) the regulatory, financial or enforcement actions taken to ensure compliance, accountability and consumer protection, along with any matter ancillary or incidental thereof?

**Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari):** (a) The Implementation Agreement (IA) was signed b/w KE and Government of Pakistan (Go P) upon privatization of KE on November 14, 2005. The IA was subsequently amended through Amendment Agreement (AA) in April 2009 (collectively referred to as “*the Agreements*”). Broadly, the Agreements established post privatization framework governing KE’s operations, financing arrangements, and mutual obligations b/w GoP and KE. KE obligations under Agreements were as follows:

- i. Generation Capacity Enhancement: To add 1,000 MW.
- ii. Uninterrupted supply to Strategic Customers
- iii. Equity Injection of USD 361 million

(b) The existing installed capacity (*as per Generation license*) of KE’s own power plants is around 2,400 MW. KE drawing 2,000 MW supply from National Grid.

(c) K-Electric is a vertically integrated utility regulated by NEPRA. The nature of the questions framed can be better addressed by the regulator, as NEPRA actively reviews such matters and is therefore in a more appropriate position to respond.

As far as the Power Division and the National Grid Company (NGC) are concerned, the interconnection capacity with K-Electric has already been enhanced from 1,000 MW to 2,000 MW in order to facilitate the supply of relatively cheaper electricity from the National Grid and to ensure continuity of electricity supply to consumers. Despite the outstanding payment amounting to PKR 372 billion, uninterrupted electricity supply to K-Electric continues to be maintained. Furthermore, the interconnection capacity is planned to be increased to over 3,000 MW in the future.

It is also pertinent to mention that K-Electric’s own generation portfolio comprises relatively expensive sources of generation, which contributes to a higher generation tariff as compared to the National Grid pool generation cost. The Power Division provides Tariff Differential Subsidy (TDS) to bridge the gap.

(d) Since privatization and up to FY 2025, KE claims that it has invested -USD 4.7 billion across the value chain. Some key operational improvements are as follows:

- i. Addition of 1,957 MW in generation capacity, resulting in fleet efficiency improvement from 30% in 2005 to 47% in 2025;
- ii. Addition of 26 grid stations, enhancing power transformation capacity by 3,616 MVAs (104%);

- iii. Addition of over 1100 feeders, resulting in distribution capacity enhancement by 5,212 MVAs (134%);
- iv. Reduction in T&D and AT&C losses by 19.5% points and 13.9% points respectively

### Future Plans

Furthermore, during the period FY 2024 to FY 2030, KE has prepared an investment plan of USD 2 billion, out of which around USD 300 million have been invested in FY 2024 and FY 2025. As a result of planned investments, following operational improvements have been planned:

- i. Addition of 13 grid stations
- ii. Addition of 400+ feeders
- iii. Addition of 755 MVAs in power transformation capacity and 2,500+ MV As in distribution capacity

(e) KE's network has total 2,136 feeders, out of which 1,508 feeders (~ 71 %) are load-shed free as per summary:

Load-shed on 628 feeders (~ 29% of KE's total feeders) is carried out on the basis of feeder-level Aggregate Technical & Commercial (AT&C) loss (i.e. theft and non-payment. Further, it is important to clarify that power interruptions arising from technical faults, system maintenance, or customer-side issues are often misconstrued as load-shed.

(f) As detailed in response to (d) above, KE has made targeted investment in its infrastructure for uninterrupted and reliable power supply. In addition, KE remains committed to reducing AT&C losses of feeders in its service area, which includes the following:

- i. Installation of Aerial Bundled Cables (ABC). To-date around 13,000 PMTs have been converted to ABC to prevent illegal abstraction of power;
- ii. Targeted kunda removal drives. During FY 2025-26, 261,832 kgs of kundas removed;
- iii. Recovery camps and schemes to improve consumer payment behavior. During FY 2025-26, 336 mega recovery camps organized across service area.

In addition, with support from Govt. of Pakistan, the interconnection capacity to draw power from National Grid has also increased to 2,000 MW.

(g) KE operates under NEPRA regime within a regulatory framework defined and enforced by NEPRA which may better share any actions or measures taken against defined Performance parameters.

**Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz):** Mr. Ahmed Hayat Lak was appointed as Managing Director/Chief Executive Officer (MD/CEO) of Oil & Gas Development Company Limited (OGDCL) on February 22, 2023, with the approval of the Board of Directors, under applicable laws and the governing framework (including the Companies Act, 2017, the State-Owned Enterprises (Governance and Operations) Act, 2023, the Articles of Association of the Company, and the State-Owned Enterprises (Ownership and Management) Policy, 2023).

The terms and conditions of his appointment, including remuneration, were determined and approved by the Board in accordance with the prescribed legal and policy framework. During the period under reference, the Company has continued to undertake its operations and initiatives in line with its approved business plans and strategic objectives, under the oversight of the Board of Directors.

**Exploration and Discoveries**

Since February 2023, OGDCL has made 19 oil and gas discoveries across Sindh, Punjab, and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, with an estimated cumulative production potential of approximately 17,123 barrels per day (BPD) of oil and 151 million standard cubic feet per day (MMSCFD) of gas. Multi-zone discoveries were recorded at Baragzai X-01, with tested cumulative production potential of approximately 15,005 BPD of oil and 45.36 MMSCFD of gas.

The year-wise position of discoveries is summarized below:

The Company maintained a reserve addition trend during the period. The Reserve Replacement Ratio (RRR) for the respective periods is as follows:

- FY 2023–24: 56%
- FY 2024–25: 167%
- FY 2025–26 (9M): 153%

The Company reserves life has therefore increased from 14 years to 17 years (as of 31 March 2026), reflecting a 3-year expansion.

**Wells Brought on Production and Monetization**

During the period under reference, OGDC brought 34 wells/fields into production, reflecting continued efforts towards timely development and monetization of discovered resources.

The year-wise position of wells brought on production is summarized below:

**Production Enhancement and Optimization**

During the period under reference, the Company undertook a range of production enhancement and optimization measures aimed at maximizing recovery from existing fields and sustaining production levels. Oil production surpassed 40,000 BPD after 6.5 years, reaching 42,000 BPD and 830 MMSCFD Processed Gas.

A total of over 65 rig workovers and 295+ rigless interventions were carried out across various fields, resulting in an estimated incremental production impact of approximately 17,000 barrels per day (BPD) of oil and 90 million standard cubic feet per day (MMSCFD) of gas.

These efforts encompassed a structured production optimization drive, including targeted well interventions, revival of shut-in wells, artificial lift optimization, and stimulation programs across mature assets. Recently, the revival of Jand-1 well resulted in an increase in gas production from approximately 7 MMSCFD to around 21 MMSCFD following recompletion and targeted stimulation.

As part of its strategic focus on maximizing recovery from mature assets, OGDC has prioritized the revitalization of the 100% owned Rajian Field, leveraging its significant remaining reserves and low recovery factor. Under the ongoing optimization drive, the Company has successfully deployed Electrical Submersible Pumps (ESPs) in key wells and transforming field performance, reviving shut-in wells and achieving substantial production uplift, including a nearly threefold increase in output from existing producers. The program is being scaled up through ongoing and planned workovers across multiple wells, alongside seven new development wells, to further unlock field potential. In parallel, dedicated heavy oil handling facilities are being developed to support increased production and address operational challenges such as asphaltene deposition through advanced chemical and downhole solutions. These integrated efforts position Rajian Field to achieve a target production of 15,000 BPD by FY 2027–28, reflecting a structured, technology-driven approach to brownfield revitalization and long-term value creation.

**Field Development Projects**

The Company progressed and completed a number of field development projects aimed at enhancing production capacity and ensuring timely utilization of discovered resources.

Key developments include the commissioning of Bettani Early Production Facilities, enabling early production from the field, and the Jhal Magsi Development Project, which was brought on stream in August 2025 with a production of approximately 14 MMSCFD of gas along with condensate.

In addition, the Dakhni Compression Project, completed in February 2026, has contributed to incremental production of gas, oil, LPG, and sulphur, while the Khewari Development Project, executed using in-house resources, has a production potential of approximately 10 MMSCFD of gas.

### **Shale/Tight Gas Initiatives**

As part of advancing its shale gas initiative, OGDC has firmed up execution timelines and development planning, with the KUC-1 horizontal exploratory well targeted in FY 2025-26. The drilling program comprises three pilot exploratory wells and four appraisal wells across the Kunnar–Pasakhi and Sinjhora West areas to delineate resource potential. The Company is simultaneously strengthening its technical roadmap, with emphasis on a robust and well-articulated shale development plan to demonstrate commitment and effectively engage service providers for successful project execution.

As part of its strategic initiative to unlock unconventional resources, OGDC is advancing a focused tight gas development program in the Indus Basin. An updated prospectivity ranking has identified high-potential blocks, while a basin-wide study expanded from 1,500 sq. km to an additional 2,600 sq. km is underway. Concurrently, development activities at priority wells are progressing through drilling and rig mobilization.

### **Oil & Gas Decarbonization Charter**

Under its sustainability agenda, OGDC has advanced key decarbonization initiatives aligned with global standards, including signing the Oil & Gas Decarbonization Charter at COP-28 and publishing its first ESG Report. The Company has partnered with OGCI and UNEP, becoming the only Pakistani entity to join OGMP 2.0, while deploying satellite-based methane monitoring (GHG-Sat) across major fields. In parallel, a Methane Emissions Inventory is being developed through the MIST tool (Carbon Limits), with pilot completion targeted by May 2026, alongside process optimization studies to reduce emissions. These efforts are supported by focused capacity building and strategy workshops, reflecting a structured approach towards emissions reduction and sustainable operations.

### **Strategic and International Initiatives**

The Company undertook a number of strategic initiatives aimed at strengthening its exploration portfolio and expanding its operational footprint.

During the period, OGDCL participated in competitive bidding rounds and was awarded seven (7) new exploration blocks, enhancing its exploration acreage. The Company also progressed its participation in offshore exploration activities, including Abu Dhabi Offshore Block-5, in collaboration with international partners.

In addition, the Company entered into cooperation and engagement with international entities, including Turkish Petroleum Overseas Company (TPOC), SOCAR (Azerbaijan), and Zarubezhneft (Russia), for technical collaboration and exploration opportunities.

### **Transparency and Corporate Governance Recognition**

OGDC has been recognized for its corporate transparency and governance practices. In the Transparency in Corporate Reporting (TRAC) Assessment 2024 conducted by Transparency International Pakistan, the Company was ranked 3rd overall among 69 public listed companies in Pakistan, with an overall score of 93.09%, and was the highest-ranked public sector company, reflecting its strong disclosure and reporting practices.

### **Indigenization Drive**

OGDC has accelerated its Indigenization Drive to enhance localization, reduce import dependency, and strengthen operational sustainability. The initiative has delivered concrete outcomes through local manufacturing and refurbishment of critical oilfield equipment, including pipes, valves, compressor components, turbine parts, and electronic systems, alongside key projects such as the Dhodak Refinery and API-certified workshop facility. Strategic measures—such as rig refurbishment, pipe conversion, and development of portable rigs—have strengthened the local vendor ecosystem and technical capability in collaboration with LUMS Energy Institute. These efforts have yielded savings exceeding PKR 860 million and foreign exchange savings of USD 3.05 million, reflecting a focused move towards cost efficiency, supply chain resilience, and self-reliance.

### **Financial Performance & Increased Share Price**

OGDCL has significantly enhanced shareholder value, with share price rising from PKR 78.00 in June 2023 to PKR 334 in January 2026 alongside a progressive dividend increase from PKR 8.55 to PKR 15.05 and payout strengthening to 41%, reflecting strong market confidence and disciplined returns.

مالی سال ۲۰۲۳-۲۵ کے دوران پاکستان کا مجموعی درآمدی بل ۰.۶۰۹ ارب امریکی ڈالر رہا، جس میں پیٹرولیم درآمدات کا حصہ ۱۵.۹ فیصد یعنی ۱۱.۱۹۳ ارب امریکی ڈالر تھا۔ چونکہ پیٹرولیم کی درآمدات مجموعی درآمدی بل کا ایک بڑا حصہ ہیں، اس لیے یہ زرمبادلہ کے ذخائر پر منفی اثرات مرتب کرتی ہیں۔ تاہم، معیشت کے پیسے کو رواں رکھنے کے لیے پیٹرولیم کی درآمدات ناگزیر ہیں، لہذا ان کی بلا تعطل فراہمی یقینی بنانا ضروری ہے۔

- (الف) وزارت نیشنل ہائی وے اتھارٹی کے لیے پی ایس ڈی پی تخصیص میں ۲۲.۳۲۸ ارب روپے کی کٹوتی کا کیا جواز پیش کرتی ہے، جبکہ یہ کٹوتی حکومت کی جانب سے ایندھن پر سبسڈی دینے کے لیے فنڈز کی فراہمی کی خاطر تمام شعبوں میں کی جانے والی ۱۰ فیصد کمی کا حصہ ہے، جب کہ ایک سال کے دوران این ایچ اے کی آمدن میں ۶۳ فیصد اضافہ ہوا ہے جو کہ ۶۶ ارب روپے سے بڑھ کر ۱۰۹ ارب روپے ہو گئی ہے اور جون ۲۰۲۶ء تک اس کا تخمینہ ۱۳۵ ارب روپے ہے؛
- (ب) آیا وزیر موصوف نے تمام شاہراہوں کے لیے باقاعدہ حفاظتی اور سیوریج منصوبہ وضع کرنے کی ہدایت کی ہے؛
- (ج) آیا ایکسل لوڈ پالیسی کو سخت کیا گیا ہے، تاہم بجٹ کٹوتی سے جاری منصوبوں بشمول کراچی-کوئٹہ-چمن ایکسپریس وے اور کراچی-حیدرآباد موٹروے کو اب بھی خطرہ لاحق ہے؛ نیز
- (د) اس کٹوتی کے نتیجے میں تاخیر کا شکار ہونے والے منصوبوں کی تفصیلات کیا ہیں؟

### وزیر برائے مواصلات (جناب عبدالعلیم خان)

(الف) این ایچ اے ایک کارپوریٹ ادارے ہے جو پارلیمنٹ کے ایکٹ یعنی این ایچ اے ایکٹ کے ذریعے قائم کیا گیا، جسے قومی شاہراہوں، موٹرویز اور اتھارٹی کے سپرد کردہ تزویراتی سڑکوں کی تعمیر، ترقی، آپریشن، مرمت اور دیکھ بھال کے پروگراموں کی منصوبہ بندی، فروغ، تنظیم اور عملدرآمد کا مینڈیٹ حاصل ہے۔ اس وقت این ایچ اے ملک میں ۱۴۵۰۰ کلومیٹر سے زائد وفاقی شاہراہی نیٹ ورک کا انتظام کر رہی ہے۔

این ایچ اے ایکٹ ۱۹۹۱ء (ترمیم شدہ ۲۰۲۳ء) کی دفعہ ۱۰(۲)(vii)، باب III این ایچ اے کو اختیار دیتی ہے کہ وہ قومی شاہراہوں، موٹرویز، تزویراتی سڑکوں اور اپنی تحویل میں موجود دیگر سڑکوں پر اپنی صوابدید کے مطابق شرائط کے تحت ٹول عائد کرے، وصول کرے یا وصول کروائے۔

مزید برآں، این ایچ اے ایکٹ کی دفعہ ۶ (نیشنل ہائی وے کونسل کے اختیارات و فرائض) کی ذیلی دفعہ (ب) کے تحت نیشنل ہائی وے کونسل (این ایچ سی) اس امر کی مجاز ہے کہ وہ اتھارٹی کی کارکردگی کے لیے پالیسیوں اور رہنما اصولوں کا تعین کرے۔ چنانچہ، روڈ ہیڈ ٹیننس اکاؤنٹ (آرایم اے) رولز، ۲۰۰۳ء مرتب کیے گئے۔ آرایم اے رولز، ۲۰۰۳ء کے تحت درج ذیل ذرائع آمدن این ایچ اے کو مجاز قرار دیے گئے ہیں:

(الف) سڑکوں اور پلوں پر ٹول؛

(ب) سڑک کے استعمال سے متعلق جرمانے (مثلاً اوور لوڈنگ، ٹریفک خلاف ورزی)؛

(ج) ایکسل لوڈ چارجز؛

(د) اضافی ہیوی و ہیکل فیس؛

(ه) بین الاقوامی ٹرانزٹ فیس؛ اور

(و) بارڈر فیس۔

این ایچ اے کی جانب سے ٹولنگ اور دیگر ذرائع سے حاصل ہونے والی آمدن روڈیہ ٹیننس اکاؤنٹ (آرایم اے) میں جمع کی جاتی ہے اور بنیادی طور پر موجودہ روڈ نیٹ ورک کے آپریشن اور دیکھ بھال پر خرچ کی جاتی ہے۔ ٹول آمدن این ایچ اے کے وسائل کا ایک بڑا ذریعہ ہے، جسے سالانہ بیہ ٹیننس پلان (اے ایم پی) کے تحت موجودہ روڈ نیٹ ورک کی بحالی اور بہتری کے لیے استعمال کیا جاتا ہے۔ دوسری جانب، پی ایس ڈی پی مختص رقوم ترقیاتی مقاصد کے لیے مخصوص ہوتی ہیں، جن میں حسب ذیل شامل ہیں:

- نئی قومی شاہراہوں اور موٹرویز کی تعمیر

- موجودہ انفراسٹرکچر کی توسیع اور اپ گریڈیشن

لہذا، آرایم اے وصولیاں بشمول ٹول آمدن، پی ایس ڈی پی فنڈنگ کا متبادل نہیں بن سکتیں کیونکہ دونوں کے مقاصد بنیادی طور پر مختلف ہیں۔ اگرچہ این ایچ اے نے آمدن کی وصولی میں نمایاں بہتری کا مظاہرہ کیا ہے اور یہ رقم ۲۶ ارب روپے سے بڑھ کر ۱۰۹ ارب روپے تک پہنچ گئی ہے، جبکہ جون ۲۰۲۶ء تک تقریباً ۱۲۸ ارب روپے وصول ہونے کی توقع ہے۔ یہ اضافہ بیہ ٹیننس اور اپ گریڈیشن سے متعلق فنڈنگ ذرائع سے تعلق رکھتا ہے اور آرایم اے رولز، ۲۰۰۳ء کے مطابق پی ایس ڈی پی مختص ترقیاتی فنڈنگ کی ضرورت کو ختم نہیں کرتا۔

(ب) وفاقی وزیر برائے مواصلات نے شاہراہوں پر سفر کرنے والوں اور مسافروں کی حفاظت اور سلامتی کو یقینی بنانے کی اہم اہمیت پر مسلسل زور دیا ہے۔ اس ضمن میں ضروری ہدایات، بشمول زبانی احکامات، وقتاً فوقتاً این ایچ اے کو جاری کیے جاتے رہے ہیں۔ اس معاملے کی اہمیت کو مد نظر رکھتے ہوئے، این ایچ اے نے مالی سال، ۲۶-۲۵، ۲۵-۲۴ اور ۲۴-۲۳ء کے سالانہ بیہ ٹیننس پلانز کے تحت بالترتیب ۷ ارب روپے، ۹ ارب روپے اور ۲ ارب روپے (منسلک-الف) مختص کیے ہیں تاکہ قومی شاہراہی نیٹ ورک پر شاہراہوں کی حفاظت اور سلامتی کے اقدامات کو بہتر بنایا جاسکے۔

(ج) نیشنل ہائی وے سیفٹی آرڈیننس ۲۰۰۰ء (این ایچ ایس او-۲۰۰۰) قومی شاہراہی نیٹ ورک اور موٹرویز پر مجاز طریقہ کار اور شیڈول-VI کے مطابق ایکسل لوڈ حدود کے تعین کے لیے قانونی فریم ورک فراہم کرتا ہے۔ این ایچ ایس او-۲۰۰۰ کے مطابق این ایچ ایم پی اس کے نفاذ کے لیے مجاز ادارہ ہے۔

این ایچ اے کا بنیادی کام نئی سڑکوں کی تعمیر اور موجودہ نیٹ ورک کی بہترین سطح پر دیکھ بھال کرنا ہے تاکہ سڑک استعمال کرنے والوں کو بہترین سہولیات فراہم کی جاسکیں۔ چنانچہ، این ایچ اے کو اپنے روڈ نیٹ ورک پر ویٹ اسٹیشن انفراسٹرکچر فراہم کرنا ہوتا ہے، بشمول ویٹ آپریشن کنٹرول اور متعلقہ عمارات جیسی سہولیات کی فراہمی، جو ملک بھر میں قائم ہیں۔

این ایچ اے کی جانب سے اقدامات:

- این ایچ اے نے قومی شاہراہوں اور موٹرویز پر ترقیاتی مقامات پر ۲۳۸ مستقل اور موبائل ویٹ اسٹیشنز کا انفراسٹرکچر فراہم کیا ہے۔  
- این ایچ اے اور این ایچ ایم پی نے اپنے روڈ نیٹ ورک پر نصب تمام ویٹ اسٹیشنز پر ۱۵ نومبر، ۲۰۲۳ء سے ایکسل لوڈ کنٹرول رجیم (اے ایل سی آر) نافذ کر دیا ہے۔

مالی سال، ۲۶-۲۵ء کے دوران نئے منصوبہ بند کراچی پورٹ حیدرآباد موٹروے (ایم-۱۰) کے لیے حکومت پاکستان کی کسی فنڈنگ کی ضرورت نہیں ہے۔ ایم-۱۰ موٹروے کے جاری عمل کی صورت حال درج ذیل ہے:

وزیر برائے توانائی (بجلی ڈویژن) (سردار اویس احمد خان لغاری)

- (الف) مورخہ 14 نومبر 2005 کو کے۔ الیکٹرک (KE) کی نجکاری پر کے۔ الیکٹرک اور حکومت پاکستان کے مابین عملدرآمد کا معاہدہ (طے پایا تھا۔ بعد ازاں، اپریل 2009 میں ترمیمی معاہدے (Amendment Agreement - AA) کے ذریعے عملدرآمد کے معاہدے (IA) میں ترمیم کی گئی (جنہیں مجموعی طور پر "معاہدے" کہا گیا ہے)۔ وسیع تر معنوں میں، ان معاہدوں نے حکومت پاکستان اور کے۔ الیکٹرک کے مابین آپریشنز، مالیاتی انتظامات اور باہمی فرائض و ذمہ داریوں کو چلانے کے لیے نجکاری کے بعد کا تنظیمی ڈھانچہ قائم کیا۔ معاہدوں کے تحت کے۔ الیکٹرک کے فرائض و ذمہ داریاں درج ذیل تھیں:

1. پیداواری صلاحیت میں اضافہ: 1,000 میگا واٹ (MW) کا اضافہ کرنا۔

2. اسٹریٹجک صارفین کو بلا تعلق فراہمی

3. 361 ملین امریکی ڈالر کا ایکویٹی انجکشن (سرمایہ کاری)

(ب) کے - الیکٹرک کے اپنے بجلی گھروں کی موجودہ تنصیب شدہ صلاحیت (بمطابق جزیئن لائنس) تقریباً 2,400 میگاواٹ ہے۔

کے - الیکٹرک نیشنل گرڈ سے 2,000 میگاواٹ بجلی حاصل کر رہا ہے۔

(ج) کے - الیکٹرک ایک عمودی طور پر مربوط (vertically integrated) یوٹیلیٹی ہے جو نیپرا (NEPRA) کے زیر انتظام کام کرتی ہے۔ مرتب کردہ سوالات کی نوعیت ایسی ہے جس کا ریگولیٹر (نیپرا) بہتر طور پر احاطہ کر سکتا ہے، کیونکہ نیپرا فعال طور پر ایسے معاملات کا جائزہ لیتا ہے اور اس لیے جواب دینے کے لیے زیادہ مناسب پوزیشن میں ہے۔

جہاں تک پاور ڈویژن اور نیشنل گرڈ کمپنی (NGC) کا تعلق ہے، کے - الیکٹرک کے ساتھ انٹر کنکشن (باہمی رابطہ) کی صلاحیت کو پہلے ہی 1,000 میگاواٹ سے بڑھا کر 2,000 میگاواٹ کر دیا گیا ہے تاکہ نیشنل گرڈ سے نسبتاً سستی بجلی کی فراہمی میں سہولت پیدا کی جاسکے اور صارفین کو بجلی کی فراہمی کے تسلسل کو یقینی بنایا جاسکے۔ 372 ارب روپے کے واجب الادا بقایا جات کے باوجود، کے - الیکٹرک کو بجلی کی بلا تعطل فراہمی برقرار رکھی جا رہی ہے۔ مزید برآں، مستقبل میں انٹر کنکشن کی صلاحیت کو 3,000 میگاواٹ سے زیادہ کرنے کا منصوبہ ہے۔

یہ ذکر کرنا بھی مناسب ہے کہ کے - الیکٹرک کا اپنا جزیئن پورٹ فولیو بجلی کی پیداوار کے نسبتاً مہنگے ذرائع پر مشتمل ہے، جو نیشنل گرڈ پول کی پیداواری لاگت کے مقابلے میں زیادہ جزیئن ٹیرف کا باعث بنتا ہے۔ پاور ڈویژن اس فرق کو پانٹنے کے لیے ٹیرف ڈیفیریمنٹل سبسڈی (TDS) فراہم کرتا ہے۔

(د) نجکاری سے لے کر مالیاتی سال 2025 (FY) تک، کے - الیکٹرک کا دعویٰ ہے کہ اس نے ویلیو چین میں تقریباً 4.7 ارب امریکی ڈالر کی سرمایہ کاری کی ہے۔ کچھ اہم آپریشنل اصلاحات درج ذیل ہیں:

1. پیداواری صلاحیت میں 1,957 میگاواٹ کا اضافہ، جس کے نتیجے میں پاور ہاؤسز کی کارکردگی 2005 (fleet efficiency) میں 30 فیصد سے بڑھ کر 2025 میں 47 فیصد ہو گئی؛

2. 26 گرڈ اسٹیشنوں کا اضافہ، جس سے پاور ٹرانسفارمیشن کی صلاحیت میں 3,616 MVAs (104%) کا اضافہ ہوا؛

3. 1100 سے زائد فیڈرز کا اضافہ، جس کے نتیجے میں تقسیم کار صلاحیت (distribution capacity) میں 5,212 MVAs (134%) کا اضافہ ہوا؛

مزید برآں، مالیاتی سال 2024 سے مالیاتی سال 2030 کے عرصے کے دوران، کے - الیکٹرک نے 2 ارب امریکی ڈالر کا سرمایہ کاری منصوبہ تیار کیا ہے، جس میں سے تقریباً 300 ملین امریکی ڈالر مالیاتی سال 2024 اور مالیاتی سال 2025 میں سرمایہ کاری کیے جاسکے ہیں۔ منصوبہ بند سرمایہ کاری کے نتیجے میں، درج ذیل آپریشنل اصلاحات کی منصوبہ بندی کی گئی ہے:

1. 13 گرڈ اسٹیشنوں کا اضافہ

2. 400 سے زائد فیڈرز کا اضافہ

3. ٹرانسفارمیشن کی صلاحیت میں 755 MVAs اور ڈسٹری بیوٹن کی صلاحیت میں 2,500 سے زائد MVAs کا اضافہ۔

### پیداوار میں اضافہ اور بہتری

زیر نظر مدت کے دوران، کمپنی نے پیداوار میں اضافے اور بہتری کے لیے متعدد اقدامات کیے جن کا مقصد موجودہ فیلڈز سے زیادہ سے زیادہ بحالی اور پیداواری سطح کو برقرار رکھنا ہے۔ تیل کی پیداوار ساڑھے چھ سال بعد 40,000 بیرل یومیہ سے تجاوز کر گئی، جو کہ 42,000 بیرل یومیہ اور 830 ملین اسٹینڈرڈ کیوبک فٹ یومیہ گیس تک پہنچ گئی ہے۔

مختلف فیلڈز میں مجموعی طور پر 65 سے زائد رگ ورک اور زاور 295 سے زائد رگ لیس مداخلتیں کی گئیں، جس کے نتیجے میں تیل کی پیداوار میں تقریباً 17,000 بیرل یومیہ اور گیس کی پیداوار میں 90 ملین اسٹینڈرڈ کیوبک فٹ یومیہ کا تخمینہ شدہ اضافہ ہوا۔

ان کوششوں میں پیداوار کی بہتری کی ایک منظم مہم شامل تھی، جس میں کنوؤں میں مقررہ ہدف کی مداخلتیں، بند کنوؤں کی بحالی، مصنوعی لفٹ آپٹیمائزیشن، اور اپنی مدت پوری کرنے والے اثاثوں میں فعالیت پروگرام شامل ہیں۔ حال ہی میں، جنڈ-1 کی بحالی کے نتیجے میں، دوبارہ تکمیل اور ہدف کے مطابق فعالیت کے بعد گیس کی پیداوار تقریباً 7 ایم ایم ایس سی ایف ڈی سے بڑھ کر تقریباً 21 ایم ایم ایس سی ایف ڈی ہو گئی ہے۔

اپنی مدت پوری کرنے والے اثاثوں سے زیادہ سے زیادہ بحالی پر اپنی تزیرویراتی توجہ کے حصے کے طور پر، اوجی ڈی سی نے اپنی مکمل ملکیتی راجیاں فیلڈ کی بحالی کو ترجیح دی ہے، جس کا مقصد اس کے وسیع باقی ماندہ ذخائر اور کم بحالی کے عوامل سے فائدہ اٹھانا ہے۔ جاری مہم کے تحت، کمپنی نے اہم کنوؤں میں بجلی سے چلنے والے سہم سبیل پمپس (ای ایس پی ز) کامیابی سے نصب کیے ہیں جس سے فیلڈ کی کارکردگی تبدیل ہو گئی ہے، بند کنوؤں کو بحال کیا گیا ہے اور پیداوار میں خاطر خواہ اضافہ حاصل ہوا ہے، جس میں موجودہ پیداواروں کی پیداوار میں تقریباً تین گنا اضافہ بھی شامل ہے۔ فیلڈ کی صلاحیت کو مزید بروئے کار لانے کے لیے، متعدد کنوؤں پر جاری اور منصوبہ بند ورک اور ز کے ساتھ ساتھ سات نئے ترقیاتی کنوؤں کے ذریعے اس پروگرام کو وسعت دی جا رہی ہے۔ اس کے ساتھ ساتھ، بڑھتی ہوئی پیداوار میں معاونت اور جدید کیمیاوی حل کے ذریعے ایسفا ٹین ڈی پوزیشن کے طور پر پیدا ہونے والی رکاوٹوں سے نمٹنے کے لیے بھاری تیل کو سنبھالنے کی مخصوص سہولیات تیار کی جا رہی ہیں۔ یہ مربوط کوششیں راجیاں فیلڈ کو مالی سال 2027-28 تک 15,000 بیرل یومیہ کا پیداواری ہدف حاصل کرنے کے قابل بناتی ہیں، جو کہ ٹیکنالوجی پر مبنی نقطہ نظر کی عکاسی کرتا ہے، تاکہ براؤن فیلڈ کو متحرک کیا جائے اور طویل مدت تک فوائد حاصل کیے جائیں۔

### فیلڈ کی ترقی کے منصوبے

نمایاں پیش رفتوں میں پینانی کی ابتدائی پیداواری سہولیات کا افتتاح شامل ہے، جس سے فیلڈ سے جلد پیداوار کا آغاز ممکن ہوا، اور جھل گسی ترقیاتی منصوبہ، جسے اگست 2025 میں تقریباً 14 ایم ایم ایس سی ایف ڈی گیس اور مائع گیس کی پیداوار کے ساتھ فعال کیا گیا۔ مزید برآں، فروری 2026 میں مکمل ہونے والے دکھنی کپریشن منصوبے نے گیس، تیل، ایل پی جی اور گندھک کی اضافی پیداوار میں حصہ ڈالا ہے، جبکہ کھواری ترقیاتی منصوبہ، جو داخلی وسائل کا استعمال کرتے ہوئے مکمل کیا گیا، تقریباً 10 ایم ایم ایس سی ایف ڈی کی پیداواری صلاحیت رکھتا ہے۔

### شیل / ٹائٹ گیس کے اقدامات

اپنے شیل گیس اقدام کو آگے بڑھانے کے سلسلے میں، اوجی ڈی سی (OGDC) نے عمل درآمد کی ٹائم لائنز اور ترقیاتی منصوبہ بندی کو حتمی شکل دی ہے، جس میں KUC-1 افقی ایکچپلوریٹری کنواں مالی سال 2025-2026 میں ہدف ہے۔ ڈرلنگ پروگرام میں کز-پاساکی (-Kunner-Pasakhi) اور سنجھورو ویسٹ (Sinjhero West) کے علاقوں میں وسائل کے امکانات کا تعین کرنے کے لیے تین آزمائشی دریافت کے کنویں اور چار اپریزل کنویں شامل ہیں۔ کمپنی ایک مضبوط اور واضح شیل ترقیاتی منصوبے کے ساتھ اپنے تکنیکی لائحہ عمل کو بھی مستحکم کر رہی ہے، تاکہ عزم کا اظہار کیا جاسکے اور منصوبے کی کامیابی تکمیل کے لیے خدمات فراہم کرنے والوں کو مؤثر طریقے سے شامل کیا جاسکے۔

غیر روایتی وسائل کو بروئے کار لانے کے اپنے اسٹریٹجک اقدام کے تحت، اوجی ڈی سی سندھ طاس میں ایک مرکز ٹائٹ گیس ڈویلپمنٹ پروگرام کو آگے بڑھا رہی ہے۔ اپ ڈیٹ شدہ امکانات کی درجہ بندی کے ذریعے اعلیٰ صلاحیت والے بلاکس کی نشاندہی کی گئی ہے، جبکہ 1,500 مربع کلومیٹر سے بڑھا کر 2,600 مربع کلومیٹر تک کا وسیع مطالعہ جاری ہے۔ اس کے ساتھ ساتھ، ترقیاتی کنوؤں پر ڈرلنگ اور ریگ موبلائزیشن کے ذریعے ترقیاتی سرگرمیوں پر پیشرفت جاری ہے۔

### آئل اینڈ گیس ڈی کاربنائزیشن چارٹر

اپنے پائیداری کے ایجنڈے کے تحت، اوجی ڈی سی نے عالمی معیارات سے ہم آہنگ کلیدی ڈی کاربنائزیشن چارٹر کو آگے بڑھایا ہے، جس میں COP-28 میں آئل اینڈ گیس ڈی کاربنائزیشن چارٹر پر دستخط کرنا اور اپنی پہلی ESG رپورٹ کی اشاعت شامل ہے۔ کمپنی نے OGCI اور UNEP کے ساتھ شراکت داری کی ہے اور واحد پاکستانی ادارہ بن کر OGMP 2.0 میں شمولیت اختیار کی ہے۔ اس کے ساتھ ساتھ سیٹلائٹ پر مبنی میتھین مانیٹرنگ (GHG-Sat) کو مختلف بڑے فیلڈز میں تعینات کیا جا رہا ہے۔ MIST ٹول (کاربن لمیٹس) کے ذریعے میتھین کے اخراج کی انویسٹری تیار کی جا رہی ہے، جس کا آزمائشی منصوبہ مئی 2026 تک مکمل ہونے کا ہدف ہے، اس کے ساتھ اخراج کو کم کرنے کے لیے پروسیس آپٹیمائزیشن کے مطالعے بھی جاری

ہیں۔ یہ کوششیں صلاحیت سازی اور حکمت عملی کی ورکشاپس کے ذریعے تعاون یافتہ ہیں، جو اخراج میں کمی اور پائیدار آپریشنز کی جانب ایک منظم نقطہ نظر کی عکاسی کرتی ہیں۔

### اسٹریٹجک اور بین الاقوامی اقدامات

کمپنی نے اپنے ایکسپلوریشن پورٹ فولیو کو مضبوط بنانے اور اپنے آپریشنل فٹ پرنٹ کو بڑھانے کے لیے متعدد تزویراتی اقدامات اٹھائے ہیں۔ اس عرصے کے دوران، اوجی ڈی سی ایل (OGDCL) نے مسابقتی بولی کے عمل میں حصہ لیا اور اسے سات (7) نئے ایکسپلوریشن بلاکس تفویض کیے گئے، جس سے اس کے دریافت کے رقبے میں اضافہ ہوا۔ کمپنی نے بین الاقوامی شرکت داروں کے تعاون سے ابو ظہبی آف شور بلاک-5 سمیت سمندر پار دریافت کی سرگرمیوں میں بھی اپنی شرکت کو آگے بڑھایا ہے۔ مزید برآں، کمپنی نے تعاون اور دریافت کے مواقع کے لیے ترکی پیٹرولیم اور سیز کمپنی (TPOC)، سوکار (آذربائیجان)، اور زار ویز نیفٹ (روس) سمیت بین الاقوامی اداروں کے ساتھ تعاون اور شرکت کا آغاز کیا ہے۔

### شفافیت اور کارپوریٹ گورننس کا اعتراف

اوجی ڈی سی کو اس کی کارپوریٹ شفافیت اور گورننس کے طریقوں کے لیے تسلیم کیا گیا ہے۔ ٹرانسپیرنسی انٹرنیشنل پاکستان کے زیر اہتمام انٹرنیٹ ان کارپوریٹ رپورٹنگ (TRAC) ایسیمنٹ 2024 میں، کمپنی کو پاکستان کی 69 سرکاری درج شدہ (public listed) کمپنیوں میں تیسرا نمبر دیا گیا، جس میں اس نے 93.09 فیصد مجموعی اسکور حاصل کیا، جو اسے سرکاری شعبے کی سب سے اعلیٰ درجہ بندی والی کمپنی بناتا ہے، اور اس کے مضبوط انکشاف اور رپورٹنگ کے طریقوں کی عکاسی کرتا ہے۔

2. With a view to ensure that elections to the Local Governments are conducted honestly, justly, fairly and in accordance with law and to ensure that the corrupt practices are guarded against, the Election Commission of Pakistan directs that:

- (i) All Executive Authorities in the Federation and in the Provinces shall not use State Resources in Local Government Elections calculated to influence the elections in favour of a particular candidate;
- (ii) If any person in Government Service misuses his official position in any manner in order to influence results of the elections, he shall be liable to be proceeded against the law.
- (iii) For Districts in respect of which Election Schedule has been issued no transfers/postings of the civil servants shall be made after the issuance of Election Schedule of Local Government Elections without prior approval of the Commission till the publication of election results;
- (iv) For Districts in respect of which Election Schedule has been issued, no leave of the Govt. Officers and Official including autonomous bodies/ authorities will be granted after the issuance of the Election Schedule of the Local Government Election without prior approval of the Commission till the publication of Election Result. In case leave has already been sanctioned, the Officer will not relinquish his charge without approval of the Hon'ble Commission.

**Note:** The offices of the Election Commission as well as the offices of District Returning Officers and Returning Officers shall remain open on all public holidays (including Sunday) if any activity provided in the schedule falls on that day.

2. With a view to ensure that elections to the Local Governments are conducted honestly, justly, fairly and in accordance with law and to ensure that the corrupt practices are guarded against, the Election Commission of Pakistan directs that:

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- (ii) If any person in Government Service misuses his official position in any manner in order to influence results of the elections, he shall be liable to be proceeded against the law.
- (iii) For Districts in respect of which Election Schedule has been issued no transfers/postings of the civil servants shall be made after the issuance of Election Schedule of Local Government Elections without prior approval of the Commission till the publication of election results;
- (iv) For Districts in respect of which Election Schedule has been issued, no leave of the Govt. Officers and Official including autonomous bodies/ authorities will be granted after the issuance of the Election Schedule of the Local Government Election without prior approval of the Commission till the publication of Election Result. In case leave has already been sanctioned, the Officer will not relinquish his charge without approval of the Hon'ble Commission.

Note: The offices of the Election Commission as well as the offices of District Returning Officers and Returning Officers shall remain open on all public holidays (including Sunday) if any activity provided in the schedule falls on that day.

All electoral activities mentioned in the aforesaid schedule shall be undertaken during office hours and the said timing will also be followed on public holidays fixed for any electoral activity of the schedule.

Polling hours will be observed from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM

**Main Case and C.M No. 1 of 2025**

Petitioner-sides have reiterated their arguments already recorded in paragraph No. 3 of order dated 18.03.2026 passed by this Court. It is added that one Citizen / voter is permitted to cast one vote against nine seats and as per the provision of section 55(4) of the Punjab Local Government Act-2025 (the 'Act') nine candidates securing

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highest number of votes in descending order, shall stand elected as general members, which infringes the principle of "one person one vote" and the Constitutional requirement of proper representation of the Citizen in the local Government. To address the same, learned law officer, has adopted only one stance that the relevant provisions are not resulting into any discrimination and this mechanism is for all the political parties and independent candidates, however, he states that some further time may also be granted to properly prepare his case on the raised question.

2. Hafiz Naeem-ur-Rehman, Ameer Jamat-i-Islami is also present, who stated that the *Act* provides indirect election for Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the union council, which infringes the right of the voters to elect their representative in local Government. He states that there is no past precedent of indirect election in the Province and for that matter in any other Province of the Country; that issues required to be resolved with the local council and their mandate is such that warrant direct representation through chosen representative of the people as given in Preamble of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan-1973 (the '*Constitution*').

3. Ch. Zulfiqar Ahmad, learned counsel for the petitioner in petition No. 74820 of 2025 states that provisions of the *Constitution* being relied by the Province relating to election of Senate or for that matter the provisions in Chapter-II of the *Constitution*, have no nexus with the question involved in this petition.

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4. Another question which has been raised in the present petition as well as in connected petitions, is regarding financial powers, alleging that section 32(2) of the *Act* is violative of Articles 17 and 140(A) of the *Constitution*, which require each Province to establish a local Government system and devolving financial responsibility to the said authority. Mr. Salman Asif Warraich, learned Assistant Advocate General submits that section 32(2) of the *Act* starts with "till such time" clearly indicating that the same is temporary arrangement and the preceding sub-section clearly provides transferring of the financial powers to local Government. Both-sides seek further time to make their submissions.

Main Case and C.M No. 1 of 2025

At the very outset, learned legal advisor of Election Commission of Pakistan has submitted notification dated 15.04.2026 and contended that Election Commission of Pakistan has issued timelines for carrying out delimitation of Union Councils in the Punjab Province.

2. Ch. Zulfiqar Ahmad, learned counsel for the petitioners has filed comparative study of the Punjab Local Government Legislations from 2001 to Punjab Local Government Act-2025 and reiterated the arguments already noted in the previous order passed by this Court. He has submitted that Article 140-A of the Constitution of

Islamic Republic of Pakistan-1973 (the "Constitution") commands to establish the local Governments and devolve authority to the elected representatives of the local Governments, therefore, indirect election of Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of a Union Council, under section 15(2) of the Punjab Local Government Act-2025 providing that such posts will be filled from amongst members of Union Council, is in direct conflict with the constitutional provisions; hence, cannot be sustained. He stated that Mayors, Deputy Mayors of Town Corporations and Chairpersons of Municipal Committees are then supposed to be elected by members of Union Council; that this inevitably means that the Mayors, Deputy Mayors or Chairperson can be elected by those who are not elected by the voters. He submits that such composition will deprive the voters and the citizens from their right to participate in the election. He has further submitted that Article 32 of the Constitution provides encouraging local Governments institutions to be composed of elected representatives of the area concerned.

3. In order to refute the contentions of learned counsel for the petitioners, Mr. Saad Bin Ghazi, learned Assistant Advocate General has relied upon case titled "Lahore Development Authority through D.G. and Others Versus Ms. Imrana Tiwana and Others" (2015 SCMR 1739), however, when confronted with observations made by the Honourable Supreme Court of Pakistan in paragraphs No. 58 and 59 of the said judgment that meaningful political, administrative and financial

authority must be devolved on the local Government and it has been expected by the Honourable Supreme Court of Pakistan that this process should be gradual as well as the authority should devolve with the passage of time; learned Assistant Advocate General instead of giving any explanation, seeks adjournment. Mr. Ibrar Ahmad, Director Legal of respondent-department also wants to seek instructions in this regard.

At present, NHA is managing federalized road network of above 14500 KMs of the country.</p> <p>NHA Act 1991 (Amended 2024) Section-10(2)(vii), Chapter-III authorizes NHA to levy, collect or cause to be collected tolls on National Highways, Motorways &amp; Strategic Roads and such other roads under its control and such terms as it deems fit.</p> <p>In addition, <u>under Section 6 (Power and functions of National Highway Council) Sub Section 1(b) of the NHA Act</u>, National Highway Council (NHC) is Competent to lay down policies and guidelines to be followed by the Authority in the performance of its functions. In this regard, necessary directions, including verbal instructions, have been conveyed to the NHA from time to time.</p> <p>Recognizing the significance of this matter, the NHA has made dedicated financial allocations under its Annual Maintenance Plans for the fiscal years 2025-26, 2024-25, and 2023-24, amounting to Rs. 1.7 billion, Rs. 1.9 billion &amp; Rs. 2.9 billion (<b>Annex-A</b>), respectively, to support and enhance highway safety and security measures across the national road network.</p>

- NHA and NHMP has implemented Axle Load Control Regime (ALCR) w.e.f 15-11-2023 on all weigh stations installed on its road network.

No GOP funding is required during fiscal year 2025-26 for newly planned Karachi Port – Hyderabad Motorway (M-10). Following is the status of ongoing process of M-10 Motorway:

- M/s NESPAK has completed the Detailed Design & Commercial feasibility study.
- Project Cost is to the tune of PKR 511 Billion.
- Project financing is planned through Public Private Partnership (PPP)
- Project PC-1 forwarded to Planning Commission in March 2026.
- Allocation will be required in next fiscal year to undertake the Project.

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

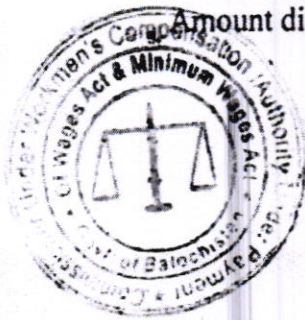
